As you read this, Easter Day is past. The crocuses have made their appearance, but for the first time in a while, the forsythia hedge on Messiah's west boundary is not yet beginning to bloom.

Easter was quite early this year—not as early as it can be, but earlier than we're used to. It came a week earlier than last year; by contrast, in 2017 Easter falls on 16 April.

The date of Easter moves around because of the formula for determining its occurrence: "the first Sunday following the first full moon on or after the vernal (Spring) equinox." This was determined by the Council of Nicea around 325 AD. Since the vernal equinox is calculated to occur on 21 March, Easter can be found on any date between 22 March and 25 April.

Here endeth the Easter trivia.

The Council of Nicea was not a trivial gathering, and its participants did not waste time on trivial matters. Out of this historic meeting of Christian leaders came the Nicene Creed, which established those Christian beliefs of which we may be sure through

Scripture and the Apostolic witness.

This was profoundly important and needful, because of the confusion resulting from various teachings which had taken hold in diverse regions in the early era of Christianity. Those of you who have participated in recent studies know several of these, including "Gnosticism" and "antinomianism."

The ideas of these early "heresies" (false teachings) were contained by the accomplishments of Nicea, but they are not extinct: we live in a time where they are again discussed, and even celebrated, in the confused theological muddle of many "mainstream" denominations.

This is one reason "history" matters: it shows us where earlier errors occurred, what people did about them, and whether ideas encountered in the "modern world" are really new, or merely "reruns" of old notions.

It is human nation to err; it is God's Nature to address human errors, whether those errors are spiritual sins, spiritual ignorance, or spiritual distraction. We Christians have such gifts as the liturgical seasons to bring before us anew the vital Truths of The Faith, and to give us ample opportunity to celebrate what is true, real, and lifechanging.

This is why Easter is both a Day and a Season. The Resurrection of Christ, following closely on His atoning Death on the Cross, is the most important event in history. Nothing else that has ever happened has changed life itself in this way, from a brief span of years to an eternal reality.

The Council of Nicea found Easter so important that they connected its observance to an event which cannot fail to be perceived in nature, the Spring Equinox, when the "dead time" of Winter ends and the season of new life and new hope begins.

I'll take a bare forsythia hedge any year in order to celebrate Easter as the most important event in my life, or in yours.

I pray that you also will continue to regard Easter as the event which gives you life, and celebrate it with thanks, praise, and the resolve to be wholly devoted to the Risen Christ long after the forsythia blooms. +
