We will do something different during Holy Week this year.

For twenty-seven years we have observed the traditional "Triduum" liturgies: Maundy Thursday, Veneration of the Cross, and the Vigil of Easter.

Historically, the Vigil was connected with Holy Baptism and Affirmation of Baptism. Although a liturgy of Affirmation of Baptism may be held for the baptized generally, we have celebrated the Vigil in connection with the Rite of Confirmation. Again this year, we have no confirmands.

We will continue the Maundy Thursday and Veneration of the Cross (Good Friday) liturgies as before, but are offering a different devotional opportunity on the Saturday evening before Easter.

The church will be open from 7 to 8.30 PM for a Vigil of Prayer and Contemplation on the Eve of Easter.

People are welcome to enter the nave and stay as long or as briefly as they choose. A devotional guide will be provided, listing the fourteen appointed Easter Vigil readings and citing several appropriate hymns for per-

sonal contemplation. Silent prayer is encouraged, and votive candles will be made available for any who choose to pray at the Communion rail, or simply approach and light a candle as a sign of the prayers which have been offered.

Congregation Council approved this new worship opportunity in order to provide worshipers with the chance to engage in personal reflection and prayerful expression regarding God's mighty acts through which we are being redeemed in Christ Jesus.

We hope you will avail yourselves of this opportunity to come before God in a very personal way as part of your preparation for the greatest Day of this, or any, year for Christians, the Festival of the Resurrection of Our Lord.

Regarding this Day, information is provided elsewhere in this issue concerning the Easter Breakfast and how to obtain tickets. The Easter Sunday liturgy is scheduled for the usual 9 AM time. There will be no Living in Faith education hour on Easter Day.

Holy Week begins with the Sunday of the Passion ("Palm Sunday") on 9 April. Mark your calendars, if they do not already highlight this essential week in Christian renewal and devotion.

Because of the March snowstorm, the midweek Lenten schedule was pushed ahead one week. Therefore, the final segment of our study of Luther's "Small Catechism" will be held on the Wednesday evening **after** Easter, with a final "Bread and Soup" meal (date: 19 April). A signup sheet will be posted for this last meal.

Since this session takes place after Lent, desserts may also be brought to be shared and enjoyed on April 19.

Please note that there will be <u>no 'In-depth Bible Study'</u> <u>in April</u>. This study will resume on the normal "second Thursday" date in May.

We encourage you to invite family, neighbors, friends and co-workers to attend Holy Week worship with you. Personal invitations are a vital part of our mission to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to others, and our Lord has commissioned each of us to share in this holy work. May the joy of the Resurrection uplift us all! +

Bread and Soup Meals




Every Wednesday evening in Lent the Fellowship Committee will be sponsoring a soup and bread supper beginning at 6 PM. Everyone is invited to at-

Trip to the Gettysburg Battlefield



The Fellowship Committee is sponsoring a road trip to the Gettysburg Battlefield on **Saturday**, **April 22**.

We will meet at the church at **7:30** AM and carpool/

caravan to Gettysburg where we will begin our day at the Visitor's Center (1195 Baltimore Pike). After viewing the magnificent Cyclorama our own military strategist and history buff Pastor Kendall will guide us around some high points of the battlefield, like the Round Tops/Devil's Den and Pickett's Charge. Come prepared to learn a lot about what happened on those three bloody days that changed the tide of the Civil War. Please bring a light bag lunch/snack and a drink. Coolers will be available for you to use to keep your meal cool. We will be stopping at the Dobbin House Tavern for an early supper, so please make sure to bring money to cover the cost. Souvenirs are available to purchase at the Visitor's Center and other shops in the town if you are interested.

To get ourselves ready to understand the scale of what we are about to see there will be an orientation session on the Battle of Gettysburg on **Sunday, April 2** (part 1) after Living in Faith Hour and on **Thursday, April 20** (part 2) at 6:45 PM. On April 2 we will enjoy a mac & cheese lunch beforehand. Please make plans to join us for both events!

March Congregation Council Meeting Highlights

The Messiah Congregation Council met on Tuesday, March 21, 2017.

- The Easter Vigil this year will be a Vigil of Prayer on the Eve of Easter. This Vigil will be a quiet, more personal experience. A list of lessons will be provided to participants, with the invitation to prayer following each lesson.
- The Fellowship Committee reported the "Spud-Tacular" luncheon was a success. On April 2 there will be a Mac and Cheese luncheon after Living in Faith. Afterwards there will be an orientation to the Battle of Gettysburg with Pastor Kendall. The second half of the orientation will be held on April 20th. On April 22nd the Fellowship Committee is sponsoring a trip to Gettysburg with Pastor Kendall as the tour guide.


