Some years ago I was asked to speak to a church's Boy Scout troop about world religions. After presenting a brief survey of Buddhism, Hinduism, Islam, Judaism and Christianity, they had a time for questions.

I was amazed to discover that the boys believed in "reincarnation." They asked: "Isn't that what Easter is about?" No one in this church-sponsored troop knew the difference between the concepts. They thought that reincarnation, part of Buddhist and Hindu beliefs, is "Christian."

explained that "reincarnation" is not Christian, while "Resurrection" is at the heart of Christian faith. Reincarnation, I told them, is a bit like an "F" grade in school, where one must repeat the course and try harder. The goal of these eastern religions is not to BE reincarnated, but to reach state a "enlightenment" at which one no longer HAS to be reincarnated.

Time did not permit me to do more with these boys, but I still remember how sad I felt, how dismayed I was for their sake that neither their parents nor their church had made plain to

them what a profound hope Christians possess because we believe in the Resurrection of the Dead.

We know that Resurrection is real because someone has *been* raised from the dead: Jesus. We know that Resurrection is integral to God's Plan because Jesus, many times, foretold His own Resurrection before it happened.

We know that Resurrection is in the future for those who give their lives to Jesus because He Himself pledged: *I will raise you up at the Last Day*.

The triumph of Easter, coming this year on the first day of April, is the greatest triumph of all human history, over the greatest opponents in the history of humankind: sin and death. The triumph is, first, the victory of our Lord Jesus; in the words of one Easter hymn, "Death could not hold Him down for long."

When one considers His innocence, His humility, and His devoted submission to the Will of the Father, these alone are sufficient grounds for us to celebrate His Resurrection on the first Easter morning. Yet all Jesus endured was

for our sake. For us, and for our salvation, Jesus left the glory of heaven and put on our frail mortal body. For the sake of our spiritual blindness, Jesus showed us the true Nature of God in His Words of wisdom, His deeds of love, and His selfsacrifice.

The hatred of His opponents? For us. The endless demands made on Him? For those with needs. The tireless teaching? For people who were walking alone because they did not know God, or what life with God is meant to be.

The atonement on the Cross? For sinners, to create a Way for sinners to be brought into the Light of God, where there is Life.

The Resurrection? For those who are mortal and die. So that not one single thing in all existence can separate from God those who want to be with God.

Easter? For us, for all eternity and for right now. We are meant to be people of *life*—people defined, not by trouble or sickness, age or an expiration date, but by our Baptism into what God has done for us in Christ. For us, there is no "F." Except in the beautiful word from God: *Life*. Amen! +


Andrew Jed Surmacz.
