tian life without it.

What if there was no such thing as Lent? How would we make sense of Easter? How would we have eyes to see the astonishing love Christ shows for us in His Passion and Death on the Cross? How would we connect **our** lives to the words and deeds of Jesus?

After all, Jesus said: *I* came not to call the righteous, but <u>sinners</u> to repentance. Imagine if Paul's words were only meant for somebody else when he wrote: God showed His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

All right, you may be thinking: "Well, I can see that there's *value* in Lent, but I don't know about it being a *gift*." Well, I think there may be a few ladies left in Messiah who remember washboards and handcranked washing machines, who wouldn't think it a stretch to call the modern washing machine a "gift." And washers only clean garments.

Lent provides cleansing for the soul that wraps up in those garments.

Lent is a gift. It provides every Christian with the opportunity to truly connect with the Gospel--God's Good News to sinners. We might think this is a given, but not so. In many congregations today, there is no Brief Order for Confession and Absolution to begin worship. There's just a brief little liturgical bit which essentially says, We're all baptized, isn't it wonderful!

Baptism is wonderful-because Baptism is God's washing of regeneration, cleansing us from sin so that we can become bonded to God in a covenant of forgiveness, adoption, and promise. Baptism is a living gift, which God nurtures throughout our

Gifts are nice to receive, but sometimes they can be a challenge. Where will I put this? When will I use this? How do I make this work? All perfectly natural and reasonable questions for just about any gift, and certainly for the one that is coming to us all soon.

I'm speaking of the Season of Lent. You see, Lent **is** a gift--a gift from God, inspired by His Spirit and handed down by His holy Church. If you have trouble regarding Lent as a "gift," just try to picture your Chris-

lives by providing us with the means to abide in that covenant-through our active life in the Church, through prayer, through discipleship, through walking with God through His Word, through agape love for our brothers and sisters in faith and our neighbors in need.

If Baptism were a one-time "magic bullet for salvation"--a term used one time by a friend from Seminary who was appalled at the "cheap grace" he heard preached more and more often from Lutheran pulpits--then we'd need none of those means God has provided to nurture our Baptismal identity. Yet they all exist, and have from the time of the apostles. The only conclusion can be: *these are necessary*.

Lent is a gift of reminder and of opportunity: reminder that, yes, these things *are* necessary, and we, being flawed human beings, are skilled at avoidance, denial, and neglect of essentials; and opportunity to do something substantive about that.

Lent is a gift, nice to receive, but a challenge. But there's good news: the challenges can all be met, and God makes it easy for us:

Where will I put this? Answer: On my calendar. Lent takes up no closet space, does not require refrigeration, and is portable. It requires your attention and dedication--in short, your integrity-but you won't need to find a place for it.

When will I use this? Answer: When it begins. Ash Wednesday, the "D-Day" of Lent, this year is on **February 18** At Messiah, worship is offered at 12 Noon and 7.30 PM. You will continue to use the gift daily until the Vigil of Easter, the day before Easter Sunday, which this year is **April 5** You may use the gift of Lent each day at whatever time of day is best for you. Although Lent is important and requires care in its use, it's also flexible.

How do I make this work? Answer: Good news! No batteries required. No tech savvy needed. No updates from Microsoft--EVER! God makes Lent work in us, when we open our hearts and minds and invite Him to do so.

To make Lent work, begin something like this:

- 1. **<u>Pray:</u>** God, be merciful to me, a sinner, and help me by showing me the truth about myself.
- 2. <u>Listen:</u> don't rush right off to something else; clear your mind, put your thoughts in "neutral," and reflect on your life--your recent words; your deeds; your habits; the things which burden you; the distance which exists between you and your neighbor, or you and God.
- 3. <u>Take in:</u> Pay heed to thoughts that come to you, to little truths which "float up" before your awareness like answers in that old "eightball" toy we used to play with.
- 4. <u>Confess:</u> Put into words the sins and failings which you come to perceive about yourself. God already knows them. The thing is, He wants YOU to know them, too, so that you and He can work on them together.
- 5. <u>Join:</u> Lent is not a solitaire game. Solitude can be good <

for reflection, but so can fellowship. Gather with other believers on the Lenten journey. Participate in the midweek gatherings this year at Messiah. Commit now to the full Holy Week worship experience, resolving to honor Christ to the fullest for all He endured for your sake.

6. Be the adult in your selfself relationship: Lent is not kid stuff, it is for mature, responsible Christians. Don't let that kid who wants to sleep in on Sunday, or find something else to do, have his or her way. God commanded us to "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Be strict with your inner child and get yourself to worship and learning, every Sunday you possibly can. Period.

Some gifts take very little effort to enjoy--a tin of cookies, a movie pass. Others require an investment to yield their intended return. Lent is such a gift--and the Giver, God, does not bestow gifts lightly, or without purpose. If God gives us this gift, it is given because we need it; because it will bless us; and because He loves us. If you receive the gift of Lent in this way, this year, you will be moved at the end to breathe a praver to your Heavenly Father, to your Savior, and to the Holy Spirit which enlightens us: Thank You so much for Your kindness.




