Pastor's Page

Our chief season of spiritual renewal, Lent, begins with Ash Wednesday worship at 12 noon and 7.30 PM on 10 February. This is an early start, for Easter is 27 March—also early.

The Church takes Lent very seriously, because it addresses the most serious aspect of our human condition: the reality of sin.

The Church responds to this condition by heeding the call of God, through the Law and the Prophets and the teachings of Christ and the apostles, for all godly people to examine ourselves thoroughly, recognize both the reality of sin in us and the specifics of our own sins, and lay them before God in humility and contrition.

God's gracious response to our honest selfexamination includes the help of His Holy Spirit to discern and understand, to trust in His mercy and hope for His pardon, and to believe in the Gospel assurance that through Christ, the debt of our sins is paid on His Cross.

Those who take seriously the suffering and death of our Lord—the price He chose to pay for our sake-respond to the Cross by welcoming the chance to lay our sins at His pierced Feet and thankfully accept blessings of forgiveness, a fresh start, and a new identity as the forgiven and adopted children of God.

For believing Christians, Lent is therefore both an obligation and a blessing. It is a time I look forward to, for my own sake as a sinner saved by grace, and for your sakes, as people who can be greatly blessed and renewed by participation in it. I hope you will welcome Lent this year, resolve to stand firm in its disciplines, and see it through to the holy remembrance of Lord's Passion and death, and to the celebration of His glorious Resurrection.

The Messiah tradition of midweek Lenten breadand-soup suppers and study will continue, with the first meal and study scheduled for Wednesday, 17 February. Meal sign-ups will be posted at the Information Center.

The focus of this year's five-week study is on "The Dynamics of the Christian Life," specifically:

What does it mean to believe in God?

What does it mean to trust God?

What does it mean to worship God?

What does it mean to love God?

What does it mean to give (share) God?

The words—believe, trust, worship, love, give—are simple, but their implications when applied to our lives lived "in Christ" are numerous and profound.

I hope you will resolve now to deepen your faith and understanding by making the most of these opportunities to grow as people of God. See you here. Pastor Kendall +



In the event of wintry weather or power outages on Sunday mornings, please listen to WLBR radio for information on worship schedules. If there is a power failure on a Sunday morning, worship will be held in the Fellowship Hall. The emergency generator provides enough light in that area.

Also, in the event of adverse weather/road conditions, the office will open as soon as conditions allow us to travel safely. On a Wednesday morning, if the Cornwall-Lebanon or Lebanon City school districts have a 2 hour delay or are closed, the Wednesday morning worship service is cancelled.

Messiah's Lenten discipline will be observed on Sunday mornings as well as WEDNESDAY evenings from


6:45 to 8:15 PM with a Lenten study series on "What does it mean to…"
