Pastor's Page

Ash Wednesday is March 1st (late this year, because Easter is not celebrated until 16 April) but given that February is a short month, and bad weather can distract us from planning, it's worth mentioning now, and announcing the 2017 Lenten midweek series.

This year marks the 500th Anniversary of Luther's posting of the "95 Theses" (not a proclamation of revolution, but an invitation to scholar debate on the theses listed).

Loads of things come to my email address, and more to the church's mailbox, offering all sorts of things to "help" commemorate the "500th Anniversary of Lutheranism."

Nearly all of these involve buying something.

I'll admit that last year I bought a little Playmobil toy figure of Martin Luther, just for fun (we've always liked Playmobil toys—ask our kids) but I'm not inclined to spend money that's not necessary on "stuff" to mark the

Reformation. We'll do that another way.

This year's Lenten midweek Bread-and-Soup supper/study gatherings (yes there WILL be bread and soup!) will take a fresh look at Luther's "Small Catechism."

The text of the SC can be found online (free!) and participants will each have a copy to view (and make notes on) as we proceed through the five study Wednesdays.

You will find that the Catechism itself is simple (so much so that Luther also wrote the "Large Catechism" to give some depth to each subject) but its implications for Christian belief and life are profound.

The SC is divided into subject areas: the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, the Ten Commandments, Confession, and the Sacraments (Baptism and the Lord's Supper). Each will receive its own Wednesday for study and discussion.

If you have maintained

your Lenten midweek discipline in recent years, you know we begin the study as early as possible after the meal is cleared (around 6:45 PM) and conclude by around 8:30 (this will be a firm goal).

You may also attend the study alone, if your schedule or diet do not allow you to share the bread/soup supper.

If you've drifted away from keeping Lent intentionally (be aware, "not eating chocolate" is not keeping Lent in a spiritual manner), this will be a good opportunity for you to renew your commitment and to renew your soul.

Mark your calendars now for Wednesday evenings in March and early April.

In closing, I'll remind you that we still have February and March before Winter is over, so maintain a "weather eye" and take care with your traction, your driving and your back muscles!



In the event of wintry weather or power outages on Sunday mornings, please listen to WLBR radio for information on worship schedules. If there is a power failure on a Sunday morning, worship will be held in the Fellowship Hall. The emergency generator provides enough light in that area.

Also, in the event of adverse weather/road conditions, the office will open as soon as conditions allow us to travel safely. On a Wednesday morning, if the Cornwall-Lebanon or Lebanon City school districts have a 2 hour delay or are closed, the Wednesday morning worship service is cancelled.

Messiah's Lenten discipline will be observed on Sunday mornings as well as the foll o w i n g WEDNESDAY


evenings from 6:45 to 8:30 PM with a Lenten study series on *Luther's Small Catechism*.
