



Dear Friend of the North American Lutheran Seminary,

Greetings! Grace and peace to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. My name is Ryan Henkel, one of the NALC seminarians studying at the North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS) and Trinity School for Ministry (TSM) this year in Ambridge, PA. I wanted to take a moment and thank you personally for your support of the NALC Scholarship Fund to offset my expenses while attending the NALS at TSM. It is with pure gratitude and appreciation towards generous donors like yourself that seminarians can accept God's calling toward a life in ministry without financial burdens looming over them.

I have completed my first year at the NALS and am set to graduate at the end of this year. I started here with an advanced standing from my undergraduate program. My wife and I are anxiously awaiting the next step in the candidacy process this coming October for my Endorsement for Internship/Vicarage. ^{*} Total Benevolence Commitment: The congregation's tithe that is designated as this congregation's benevolence support will consist of 10% of offerings received in regular giving envelopes and other benevolences as specifically determined by Congregation Council.

Notes for 2019 Ministry Plan

- Pastor's Letter of Call has been modified to set the 2018 total salary and housing amounts as the minimum salary guideline rate going forward. The 2019 salary amount reflects a 2% increase in salary and housing for 2019. The word "amount" refers to the minimum salary guidelines that are used to calculate Pastor's salary. Pastor Kendall made this recommendation to modify the Letter of Call.
- In May of 2018, the Council took action to reduce the number of secretarial hours per week beginning Jul 2018. The 2019 salary amount reflects that 2018 reduced amount plus a 3% increase.
- The City of Lebanon has assessed an additional annual fee for Chesapeake Bay stormwater run-off. The former line item for Deficit Reduction has replaced with Chesapeake Bay Stormwater Runoff.
- 4. In light of the deficit, this figure reflects one a Capella Sunday per month.
- Benevolence Breakdown for 2019: The committee recommends the following benevolence amounts for 2019 as follows:
 - NALC \$8040 per year or \$670 each month (6.0%)
 - 2. Atlantic Mission District \$600 per year or \$50 per month (.5%)
 - 3. NALC Partner Ministries (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter (.4%)):
 - a. Ethiopian Church Relief Fund
 - The Great Commission Society
 - Water Missions International
 - d. Lutheran Bible Translators
 - 4. North American Lutheran Seminary- (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 5. Independent Church in India (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 6. Caring Cupboard (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 7. Lutheran World Relief (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 8. Lebanon Free Clinic (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 9. NALC Disaster Response (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 10. Lebanon Rescue/Agape (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 11. City of Lebanon (in lieu of taxes) (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)

TOTAL Estimated Benevolence Giving: \$12,060 (represents 10% of 2019 estimated giving)

6. ***Please Note: In December of each year, the finance committee will review offerings given for the year to determine if there are additional offerings to send to each organization based upon our 10.00% tithe. The additional offerings will be divided according to the percentages listed above and sent to each organization.
