Pastor's Page

It hardly seems possible that twenty years ago, people were obsessing about "Y2K". No one knew whether computers would die, planes would fall from the sky, and civilization would come to a blue-screen-of-death halt. This didn't happen, of course, but at the passing of a calendar year, there is always the prospect of "change."

This year, one change is evident: the pavilion in the back yard is no more.

Why? The pavilion has been there since the early '70s. It received a new roof fifteen or so years ago, but had the original sheathing under the tar paper and shingles. Over the years—especially over the recent very wet years—the sheathing rotted in many places.

In addition, the pilings and roof supports were original and had deteriorated considerably. Recent winds also tore off some of the east gable panels.

The pavilion was not in

good condition, and restoration would have been costly—and relatively pointless, for the congregation has not used it in years. Perhaps twenty years ago, we offered its use, free of charge, to members who wished to have family gatherings or picnics; the best anyone can remember, this never happened.

Besides the silliness of repairing a structure that doesn't get used, we had another problem: the roof on the storage shed no longer keeps the rain out. This roof has always been problematic because of how the pavilion roof and shed roof bumped into each other.

With the pavilion gone, we can now build a simple peaked roof over the storage building. The Property Committee plans to undertake this job "in-house" with church volunteers this spring. If you would like to help, you will be welcomed with open arms. Watch the bulletins in springtime for an announcement, or speak to Harry Hatt re: the project. Now, to other things . . . Carey and I would like to thank everyone who contributed to the congregation's Christmas gift to us. Your kindness and generosity are very much appreciated. We are also very thankful for your Christmas cards and greetings. I'm sorry we can't send a card to every one of you, but we truly appreciate that you remember us this way.

Now, as we prepare ourselves to write "2020" on everything and bid "'19" good-bye, I'd like to thank you all for your Christian fellowship and service. Notes for 2020 Ministry Plan

Pastor's Letter of Call was modified in 2018 total salary and housing amounts as the minimum salary guideline rate going forward. The 2020 salary amount reflects a 0% increase in salary and housing for 2020 from the 2019 amounts. The word "amount" refers to the minimum salary guidelines that are used to calculate Pastor's salary. Pastor requested no increase in salary for 2020.

The secretary's salary amount reflects a 2% increase for 2020.

In light of the deficit, this figure reflects one a Capella Sunday per month.

Benevolence Breakdown for 2020: The committee recommends the following benevolence amounts for 2020 as follows:

TOTAL Estimated Benevolence Giving: \$12,060 (represents 10% of 2020 estimated giving)

***Please Note: In December of each year, the finance committee will review offerings given for the year to determine if there are additional offerings to send to each organization based upon our 10.00% tithe. The additional offerings will be divided according to the percentages listed above and sent to each organization.
