Pastor's Page

Behold, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them." (Is. 42:9)

I am sure you either heard or yourself have said, "If I were given a chance to go back in time. . ." I would have changed or I would corrected this or that.

The fact of the matter is that we cannot go back in time to change anything. If we can change anything, it is at the present to change or amend our ways, our actions, or our plans.

The last year is gone for good with its impacts, and we are not going to re-live it again.

However, the Lord our God has given us this new year, 2023 and we are to ask God what He wants us to do and what He wants us not to do both individually and collectively. The trees which seem barren now will not be clothed with the leaves of last year but with leaves and beauty of this new year. Thus this new year is given

The prophet Joel calls God's people to blow the trumpet in Zion; alarming the people of God to repent and return to God. The prophet was warning the people against the impending judgment of God. As you may know, God always warns His people before He brings any disasters upon them.

I do not know whether you remember or not, but this passage from Joel is often read on Ash Wednesday.

During this time of the year, I am calling you to join me to devote your time for prayer, Scripture reading, and fellowship with the whole family of God's people. It is always in the sense of unity, fellowship, and the bond of spirit that the church can thrive in its mission, vision, and outreach for the sake of the Gospel. It is only in promoting the well-being of the whole body of the Church that we grow stronger in mission and vision.

Sisters and brothers, our individual security and well -being can only be realized when the whole community is well and secure. You see, what affects the community and the neighbors affects us individually as well.

During this season of Epiphany, I encourage all of you to ask yourselves one fundamental question; "What is the most important thing which God wants me to do in life?" The way we answer this question informs the direction of our spiritual journey as well as the maturity of our faith in the knowledge of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

I am not trying to lecture you about some sort of philosophy, but what I am trying to do is challenge you to take your spiritual journey to another level. Asking the right question helps us to find the right answer.

In the coming weeks, I am also compelled to preach on the theme "maturity," and please pray for me and come to church in the coming weeks, and also invite someone with you, which is what I mean when I say to "blow the trumpet."

Therefore, my sisters and brothers in Christ, let us all blow trumpets in Lebanon and beyond, and remind all people of the need to repent and return to God. Blow the trumpet and call people to worship and service.



Notes for 2023 Ministry Plan

- The Pastoral compensation package for 2023 was approved at the Special Congregational meeting on October 23, 2022. The decision was made to provide 2/3 part-time compensation. The compensation package also includes covering the costs to attend the AMR and NALC convocations. This increase is reflected in NALC/AMR Convocations line item under Administrative Ministries.
- The Office Manager's salary amount reflects a 10% increase for 2022, which defrays some of the cost of living increases resulting from current inflation rates.
- These line items have been increased or decreased to better reflect the change in costs for those expenses.
- The Christian Education line item has been increased to reflect the cost of materials for Living in Faith hour at all age levels.
- This amount reflects a compensation rate of \$150.00 per Sunday and elimination of the A Capella Sundays.
- Benevolence Breakdown for 2023: The Council recommends the following benevolence amounts for 2023 as follows:
 - 1. NALC \$8040 per year or \$670 each month (6.0%)
 - 2. Atlantic Mission District \$600 per year or \$50 per month (.5%)
 - 3. NALC Partner Ministries (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter (.4%)):
 - a. Lutheran Military Veterans and Families Ministries
 - b. The Great Commission Society
 - c. Water Missions International
 - d. Lutheran Bible Translators
 - 4. North American Lutheran Seminary- (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 5. Independent Church in India (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 6. Caring Cupboard (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 7. Lutheran World Relief (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 8. Lebanon Free Clinic (\$380 divided \$95.00 per guarter) (.4%)
 - 9. NALC Disaster Response (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 10. Lebanon Rescue/Agape (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)
 - 11. City of Lebanon (in lieu of taxes) (\$380 divided \$95.00 per quarter) (.4%)

TOTAL Estimated Benevolence Giving: \$12,060 (represents 10% of 2022 estimated giving)

7. ***Please Note: In December of each year, the finance committee will review offerings given for the year to determine if there are additional offerings to send to each organization based upon our 10.00% tithe. The additional offerings will be divided according to the percentages listed above and sent to each organization.
