December is busy for pastors as we try to accommodate both parish and family preparations for Christmas, but it's busy for parish secretaries/office managers too (especially one who's married to a pastor!) so I thought: *I must adapt to Robin's needs here*.

Which started my train of thought running . . .

I'll get to that in a moment, but first, I hope that by the time you read this, you will have had a blessed, safe and joyous celebration of Christmas, family, feasting, and contented reflection upon God's marvelous gifts to us. I also wish you a very fulfilling and healthful New Year as we adapt to writing "2017."

Now back to that train, because it's running along the track making this sound: adapt-adapt . . . adapt-adapt . . . adapt-adapt . . .

We enter each New Year wondering what will transpire. Some of us make resolutions. Many wonder about what will change.

We know "change" is upon us as Messiah, for the old model of congregation life is no longer sustainable. The small adjustments we have made already are only the beginning of what will be experienced over the next few years.

Sometimes "change" is worrisome. Sometimes it is reason for gladness. Baby Jesus was surely glad when His mother changed Him—all babies appreciate such a change.

Mary and Joseph marveled and rejoiced at the new child, born safely and spirited away to refuge in Egypt, promised as God's Gift to Israel. They accepted the necessity of

this exile as the best way to deal with the murderous threat of King Herod, until, three years later, welcome change came in the form of Herod's death. Then they could return to Nazareth.

Mary and Joseph adapted to their circumstances. Here is a lesson for us. "Change" may be something we choose to effect, or "change" may be imposed upon us. But God gives us all the power to adapt in the best possible way in every circumstance.

We adapt to life changes, like a stiff knee or diminished vision, to children moving away and to new requirements. work Christians are adapting all the time to faith challenges and faith opportunities. In fact faithful disciples look forward to adapting, with God's Help, and so serving God and neighbor in the best possible way. We know that to adapt means to follow where Jesus leads: and our Lord always leads us according to His loving Plan for us all. +
