The Lord replied: "My Kingdom is not from this world."

As citizens, through Baptism, in the Kingdom of Jesus, these are important words to remember. Paul wrote to the Philippians: Our citizenship is in heaven, and from there we eagerly await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ...

You and I are citizens of Heaven: the Word of God says so. This world is most definitely **not** Heaven. We are not "at home" in this world, and if we are "born anew" by water and the Spirit, we can never be at home here.

We are strangers from a faraway Land, strange to those who do not know what is to have the King of Kings enthroned in our hearts and lives.

Nowadays people may grumble and complain about things like taxes, health insurance, traffic, crime, the cost of things or the latest scandal.

But many people think of "change" only in terms of annoying things in this life becoming less annoying, or hard things getting easier, or the desirable things of this life becoming more attainable. Most don't get up in the morning hoping something turns the whole world upside-down.

The Epiphany theme is: <u>This is exactly what has</u> <u>happened, and God is the</u> <u>One Who has done it—for</u> <u>all humankind!</u>

God "put on flesh" and came among us to turn everything in this world, indeed everything in the universe, upside-down. Jesus overturns everv worldly definition of "power," "hope," "love" and even "life" itself. In their place, Jesus brings altogether better meaning to all these-and applies these to all who believe.

As His emissaries from the New Land of the Kingdom. we have much to make known to people we love, people we know, and even to strangers. In Christ, "turned the God has world upside-down" in the most wonderful, astounding ways. This Good News is our mission and our gift to share as we adore and serve the King. +
