Pastor's Page

Martin Luther described Christians as members of "the priesthood of all believers." Every lawful vocation, Luther taught, is holy and pleasing to God in equal measure. God "assigns" (bestows, distributes) talents (abilities, strengths, gifts of learning) in accord with God's Plan for each human life.

Thus, each of us has his or her "ministries" in the present time, each with meaning and value in the Sight of God and in our regard for one another.

There is a particular "realm of vocation" from whose ministers we have all received abundant benefits. I call it a "realm" because it is a very varied and diverse set of ministries all of which contribute to one overarching goal. This is the realm of all <u>Ministers</u> of Health and Wellbeing.

Have you ever considered how *many* kinds of people, how *many* kinds of skills, in how *many* different settings, are involved in fostering the health and healing, wellness and quality of life for all of us? I couldn't begin to name them all. What I do know is that many Messiah members now serve in ministries of healing and health, or have so served in the past. I enjoy learning what people do; it helps me understand and appreciate them more.

Often, people carry out their work without others knowing what they do, or receiving any expressions of affirmation for their efforts, just because we don't think to make time to find out the nature of one another's vocations.

With this in mind, and after consulting with some of our "Ministers of Health and Wellbeing," I've decided to make time to do this.

On <u>Sunday</u>, <u>2</u> September, we will, during the liturgy, recognize, give thanks for, and pray for everyone in Messiah who is part of this realm of vocation.

So that we don't miss anyone, I ask that if you work in any aspect of health care or personal care, or have done so in the past, you please notify Robin in the office (717-272-2922) or by email to the church <u>messiahluthleb@epix.net</u> with your name and role in the field.

We won't be able to have everyone present on 9/2 including my wife, who is a Medical Technologist but must work that Sunday—but we hope to have everyone's name and role.

Obvious examples are physician, dentist, physiassistant, nurse cian's (BSN, RN, LPN), nurse's aide; but let us not forget dieticians, therapists, transporters, EMTs, paramedics, technical specialists (X-ray, MRI, CT, etc.), facility maintenance people, food preparation specialists, and all other associated health-related vocations. We want the chance to give thanks for everyone whom God has chosen, equipped, and called to love their neighbor by partnering with God in these ministries.


We also plan a meal that day (details to be worked out, but plan on a covered dish) and time during the Living in Faith hour for folks to talk about what they do if they would like to.




June Congregation Council Highlights


