apart, were prohibited. We still have arbitrary limits on numbers allowed at a gathering, without reference to the size of the room involved. We have heard some mayors voice threats to "close churches" for a year, or even for good, if those churches did not follow orders.

I found myself thinking of my "driver's ed" handbook, which emphasized: *Driving is not a right, it is a privilege*. Freedom of worship is a **right**. At least, it used to be. What the future holds for the free exercise of religion in this country is uncertain. Much has changed.

God, all-wise and allpowerful, can, and does, bring good out of even the worst situations. As people of faith, one of our most important tasks is to <u>search for the good God is</u> <u>bringing forth in these</u> <u>days.</u>

At the onset of the viral pandemic, I heard some say "This will bring people back to God." I disagreed. Some said the same thing after 9/11. But as we have seen, people did not become more godly, upright, or spiritually awakened after 9/11. They just wanted a "bailout from God." Soon after, many stopped thinking about God in their lives just as they had before.

So let us concentrate, not on what *others* have, or have not, learned, but on what *we*, members of the Body of Christ, are being shown by God.

God shows us that "Sunday as usual" is an assumption, not a guarantee—and an unimaginative, rather lax assumption at that. We had it until we didn't.

Now, we have the opportunity to worship in God's House, together, for a time. I am choosing NOT to say "going <u>back</u> to church." We can't "go back." It's not the same as it was.

I believe God means this for good—our good, the good of many. We are meant to <u>be thankful for</u> <u>the opportunity</u> to be in God's House, gathered to worship God, to hear the Word, to share the sacred Meal, and to be <u>in agape</u> <u>community</u> with our brothers and sisters. And we are meant to <u>make the</u> <u>most of these opportunities while we have them.</u>

## **Pastor's Page (continued)**

For now we know that such opportunities can be lost: lost because of disease; lost because of violence in the streets; lost because rights can be eroded by abuse of power.

God calls us to "come back"—to *return to the Lord your God, for He is gracious and merciful.* But God never tells us to "go back." God says: <u>Go forth.</u> Move *ahead. Follow My Son.* 

Each of us must decide *how* we will respond to what God is showing us; each one will *order his or her priorities* in light of what has now been shown, to make the most of the opportunities we are given—and to guard and preserve them in the times to come. When we gather as the Church, we place ourselves on the front line of our response.

May God be with you. +

### **Protocols for Safe Worship**

- Doors are propped open before worship so fewer people will handle the door handles.
- Pews are marked at proper "physical distancing" intervals, with every- U other-row seating including, if necessary, the choir loft as an "overflow space."

• Offering plates are placed beside Communion cup trays to receive Sunday offering.



• All worshipers and worship leaders are asked to wear masks except during the sermon and to receive the Sacrament for the foreseeable future.

- Everyone will refrain from shaking hands or hugging during sharing of the Peace, while greeting each other or taking their leave from one another.
- Remember, if you cough or sneeze, to do so in the crook of your arm with your head tilted away from others. Wash your hands after you use the restroom. Restroom doors are propped open.
- Living in Faith will resume on **Sunday**, **July 5**, and will be located in the nave.
- Conditions permitting, the Wednesday morning service of Anointing and Holy Communion will resume on **Wednesday**, **July 15**.



Beginning on **July 12** Karen Fox will be leading a NEW Living in Faith study in the nave.

The goal of this study is to grow in our ability to make more faithful, Christ-centered choices both in serving God and in fostering our own wellbeing. This will not be a "how-to" program but an experience in conversation, reflection, prayer, and seeing ourselves more clearly. Participants need not read anything in advance; the only materials needed will be a notebook, journal or tablet and a writing instrument. People will be welcome to share thoughts and ideas, or simply to listen and absorb.



Some weekday prayer, reflection and, if desired, journaling will be helpful.
