Pastor's Page

I write this with a pending appointment this afternoon for an oil change, lube and filter (for my vehicle, not for me). The ol' Green Machine has 180,500 miles on it, and since it now sports new tires and front struts, I hope it will last 'til 200,000. It's not pretty, but it runs.

Without regular maintenance, and learning to live without certain things (such as air conditioning), it would have been long gone. I'm glad I learned long ago how to maintain a vehicle so it lasts.

Here at Messiah we're also learning how to maintain a congregation so its ministries last. Most congregations are struggling to make ends meet financially, and to carry out ministries with fewer people willing or able to serve, and we are no exception. What is exceptional in our community is the spirit of commitment, vision and openness which our leaders exhibit all the time. Though it can be discouraging to see needs which resources cannot meet, they continually seek faithful and creative ways not only to maintain, but to improve the congregation's life and witness.

Your help is essential in at least three ways: your prayers (for God's guidance, help and strength for all of us); your financial offerings (set aside every week, not just when you are able to attend worship); and your offerings of time and involvement. Don't doubt your ability; God and your fellow members will help you, and each of us have much to offer. Please don't wait to be asked; let us know you are available, and we will offer you many opportunities to serve God and neighbor that fit your strength and schedule.

Through these three, you will also provide another essential help to Messiah and its leaders: encouragement. Thank a Council or committee member or someone working on the grounds or building—with a smile. It will mean a lot.

And now, an important word from Robin

Harris, our office manager:

If anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for his own family, he has disavowed the faith and is worse than an unbeliever. - 1 Timothy 5:8

These words really smacked me in the face. And made me think of my 21 month old great-niece Lillian ("Lily"). Lily was born to a mother who was incapable of taking care of her and a father who walked out on her. She was left to her grandmother who struggled desperately to care for her and for her own elderly father. Lily has been dealt a very pitiful hand in her very short life.

After much discussion, deliberation and many prayers my husband Bennett and I decided we needed to step in to Lily's life and provide for her in all ways. We spoke to our three children who are 100% behind our decision to sue for legal custody of Lily. So, we hired a lawyer, completed the necessary paperwork and are in the process of acquiring custody of our 21-month old great-niece.

When my own children were that young I stayed home to raise them. But my situation has changed since those days. I plan to continue to work here at Messiah for the hours that I am contracted to work. However, some days I may work "different" hours due to the demands of a toddler and getting her settled into our family routine. Lily will be in day care for the hours that I am here at the church, but sometimes I may need to adjust my hours (like if she is sick or has an appointment that I could not make outside Messiah office hours). I will do my best to be here when I am supposed to be here, but I ask for your patience as we adjust to being parents of an active toddler who will have some emotional baggage to work through.

We will be traveling to NC to finalize the our legal guardianship in the coming weeks, and I will be out of the office for that time. I ask for your prayers for patience, guidance, and wisdom as we adjust to bringing our new daughter home. Thank you, and God bless you.





May Congregation Council Meeting Highlights

The Messiah Congregation Council met on Tuesday, May 12, 2015.

- There were eight members present. Two were excused.
- Devotions were led by Charlotte Varone. Teenie Batdorf will lead devotions next month.
- A letter was received from the City of Lebanon asking for a donation in lieu of taxes. This was tabled until the end of the year.
- A motion was approved to donate \$600 to ship supplies to Haiti. We have done this before. The money comes out of the benevolence portion of the Zeller Trust.
- The discussion on the new child abuse law resulted in an agreement of what we need to do to comply. Pastor Kendall will write up the policy for Council approval.
- We approved \$555 for repair to the emergency generator.
- The contract with Blatt & Myers Electrical Contracting was signed for the project of replacing the lights in the fellowship hall, conference room and Pastor's office plus replacing all the bathroom wall heaters. Total cost is \$7,995.
