### The Call Process from a Pastor's Family Perspective

In 1977 Barry and I met during our last semester at Lebanon Valley College. After graduation I "followed him home" as he liked to say.

My first job as a medical technologist was at the Osteopathic Hospital on the East Shore of Harrisburg. He returned home to his mother who had been widowed the prior summer. After painting the outside woodwork, be began working in the automotive department of the local Sears on the West Shore near his home.

For the next two years, as our relationship grew, he struggled with how to use his English degree. He took the tests and qualified for getting a masters in business administration. He was contemplating a career in hospital administration.

In the beginning of 1979 Barry realized that, although several schools were interested in him, he was being led in a different direction. Some time prior to proposing marriage, he asked me how I felt about being a pastor's wife. My response was that, although it would be like living in a glass house and as long as it was OK to hang out laundry, I was agreeable.

So, on St. Patrick's Day we were engaged; in April he interviewed with the seminary review board; in August we married and moved to the seminary in Gettysburg. I worked at the Gettysburg Hospital to pay our bills and tuition. Four years later, with our first child on the way, Barry graduated.

At the time of graduation Barry did not have a call, and we were a bit anxious since our baby was due in October. When filling out paperwork for his first call Barry had requested a small town in a rural setting not too far from his mother. The Bishop found him an opening in July at Salem Lutheran Church, Oberlin. He accepted without further searching, was ordained and began ministry in August. Within about three years it became evident it was time to seek a new call.

This time around there were more things to consider as we had grown to a family of four. We began praying in earnest for guidance and for the Spirit to lead us to our next church.

The ELCA call process allowed a church to look at several candidates at the same time, but a pastor seeking a call could only receive one church at a time. We made a trip to look at a church in the Upper Susquehanna Synod, and Barry spoke with their call committee. He also talked with a call committee for a church in Lancaster County before meeting with Messiah's committee. After each visit we pondered pros, cons, and prayed.

We had many questions—what is the location like? Neighborhood of the church? Condition of the church building? How much of the congregation's resources go to maintenance? To ministry? What are the congregation's demographics? Do they have active committees? Are they spiritually alive? What expectations do they have for the pastor? His spouse? Is the financial package adequate? Is it a good environment for our children? Will we need to buy a house? What is the reputation of the schools? Are there job opportunities for Carey? How far from parents and other family?

Barry and I became pretty savvy about what he would consider after our experience at Salem. We prayed for the ability to know if we should reject a church or continue in the call process. We were seeking God's will for us and for the church in question.

The next step after meeting with the call committee was preaching for the call committee. We got to that point only with Messiah and arranged for a pulpit exchange with a

nearby church. That meant I was taking our 2 and 4 year old sons to a strange church and out to lunch with a group of strangers. I explained to Scott that it was important for him to be a good boy (and hoped David would be, too). Fortunately, all went well both at the church and in the restaurant. We went home and prayed some more as we anxiously waited to see if Messiah would extend a call.

At last, after two years in this process, the invitation came for the trial sermon at Messiah and the vote. You know the ending of the story, but you may not know how blest we felt to be here where we could PAGE 2

feel the Spirit was alive and know this was where He wanted us to be.

A pastoral call is a unique relationship. It involves both the pastor and congregation submitting to the will of God. Unlike the secular world of employee/ employer both pastor and congregation are under the authority of God. Let us remember that God has a plan for Messiah and continue in prayer for a pastor to lead us to fulfill our purpose in His Kingdom.
