Pastor's Page

Once again for Lent 2019, we will enjoy Wednesdayevening bread-and-soup meals and a study. More on this in a moment; first, a request.

At our house, we still use a landline, for privacy and security during confidential calls.

Consequently we receive many calls from telemarketers as well as what I call "scout calls" (those annoying times when the telephone rings, but when one answers, there is nothing at the other end).

Because of these "scout calls," we sometimes do not pick up when the telephone rings, for we've learned that not long after a scout call, we receive a telemarketer call (or two or three, until they give up because we don't answer).

When you have a priority need for pastoral care, your call is important and won't be ignored. Carey and I ask that if you call us and we don't answer, please leave your name and telephone number (speak slowly and clearly). If we're home, we will call

you back as soon as we check to see if a caller has left a message.

We both appreciate that you are considerate of our 'home time' and try not to call our residential number concerning minor matters. However, we do not want you to refrain from calling in the event of a matter that cannot wait, or of an emergency. In such a case, please call.

You need not provide private details of the matter at issue when you leave your message—just make sure I can identify you and return your call to the correct number (include Area Code please!). Be assured that I'll return your call as soon as I can.

Now, back to Lent: this year the subject will be one which applies to every single disciple of Christ: *Stewardship*.

"Stewardship" is a central theme of Scripture in both Old and New Testaments, but you might not fully realize how comprehensive the concept truly is.

The five midweek sessions will each examine one

aspect of stewardship—which has many synonyms, including "management," administration" and "allocation." Keep these synonyms in mind as you examine these topics:

Stewardship of *discern-ment*: How a disciple manages the matters of significance in life.

Stewardship of *relation-ships*: How a disciple manages our connections to others.

Stewardship of *self*: How a disciple manages his/her own being.

Stewardship of resources: How a disciple manages what God entrusts to our responsible use in this life.

Stewardship of *opportunities*: How a disciple manages the choices which we encounter as we pass through this life.

I look forward to this study, because it's really about how we make the most of God's blessings and purposes for us. I hope you'll join us, beginning on 13 March. +

The vital penitential season of Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday, March 6.** On Ash Wednesday, you will have the option of attending either a mid-day liturgy, with proclamation and the impo-

sition of ashes beginning at 12 noon, or the customary evening liturgy at 7:30 PM.

Both liturgies will feature the same sermon. The noon lit-

urgy is to make the time easy to remember, and to make attendance possible for people who might take time at lunch, for those who do not drive at night, or who must work a late shift.

February Congregation Council Meeting Highlights

The Messiah Congregation Council met on Tuesday, February 19, 2019.

There was no meeting in January.

- Fellowship: Bread and Soup suppers for Lent are being planned. The meals will extend from March 13 until April 10, 2019, weather permitting.
 - The Easter Breakfast will be served in the Chapel Classroom. Tickets will go on sale (\$2.00 each) AFTER church.
 - A Sundae Bar with homemade ice cream, toppings and hot dogs is being planned for July 6th.
 - A picnic with the ladies from the churches that helped with food preparation and service for the Convocation is being explored. Other Fellowship activities are in the works.
- Council approved \$12,000 from a recent bequest to be applied to the roof loan to reduce the principal.
- \$1,000 from the Zeller Trust was approved to be sent to ICII to help with the rebuilding necessary after the cyclone rendered some of their buildings inhabitable.
- Harry Hatt reported that the Fellowship Hall will be painted.
- Harry and Karen Hatt are donating leftover building materials to help replace the shed roof. The church would fund the other materials needed.
- Thanks were expressed to all the Messiah volunteers and the Missionary Church for all the custodial help that is given.
