Pastor's Page

And so, through all the length of days, Thy goodness faileth never. Good Shepherd, may I sing Thy praise within Thy House forever.

—Verse 6, "The King of Love My Shepherd Is," by Henry Baker

Looking out the window at another wet, dreary late-winter day, I remembered that the name "Lent" came from the Old English word lencten, which meant "spring." After a thirty-inch snowstorm, inundating rains, power outages, and the short, dark days, many are looking forward to spring, t o the "lengthening of days."

These longer days, more than any groundhog, assure us that winter is winding down and spring is coming.

This thought, in turn, brought the lovely hymn verse above to mind. I had never thought of this as a Lenten hymn, but it could be—not in the usual penitential sense of sorrow for sins, but for another reason altogether.

We are in "the length of

days" that is the Lenten season, and we are called to self-examination, penitence, and heightened resolve to follow our Lord in faith and commitment.

Yet even in the midst of somber reflection on our sins. God's goodness never fails us. Our very spirit of regret for our weakness and our rebelliousness is inspired by the Spirit of God. gives us such awareness not to burden or frighten us, but to lift us from lives of darkness, storms, fear and doubt to a far better life: the life that is turned toward God in trust and in longing for a closer walk with Him.

Where would we end up if God did not care enough about us to call us home to Him? We would remain in those dark places. Indeed, we'd become so grown into them that we would mistake the darkness for light.

We know this is true, for we see it in the lives of many who are turned from God and even hostile to others who are not so turned away. The fruits they yield are resentment, rationalization, denial, frustration, and unsettlement that can boil over into despair: an unending "winter of the soul."

We are profoundly blessed because God has called us from spiritual winter into the eternal spring of His Light. He is reminding us that He has done something about our lost-ness. God has established a Place outside the darkness, a place of abundant life and abiding hope. He calls us to look upon the Cross and the Crucified One. He reminds us that as spring approaches, so do we approach the celebration of God's gracious favor for us, shown both upon the atoning Cross and by the empty Tomb which speaks volumes about the love and power of God in Christ Jesus.

He tells us again, through the steady witness of the Church, that we have every reason to "sing His praise within His House forever"—because He has made a place for US there. Spring does not stop with Easter; for us, "spiritual spring" is just beginning.

Lenten Bible Study




Pastor Kendall is leading a Lenten study series asking "What does it mean to..." every Wednesday evening during the season of Lent. The schedule is as follows:
