Pastor's Page

As you know, Pastor Billy Graham entered the Church Triumphant a few days ago. Among many illnesses he suffered in his final years, he lived for several decades with Parkinson's Disease and had bouts of encephalitis and pneumonia.

Up until his death, he continued to post messages on social media. His final message (2/20) is most appropriate for this season of self-examination and amendment of life:

If you went for a walk in the woods, but then decided to wander off the path, and found yourself surrounded by a thicket of thorns and poison ivy, who would you blame? Would you blame the person who built the path? No, of course not. Instead you'd blame yourself if you were honest, because you alone were responsible for wandering from the path.

In a far deeper way, this is what happens when we decide to leave God out of our lives. For a time, it may seem like wandering away from Him doesn't make any difference; it may even seem easier and freer. But eventually it catches up with us—just as

wandering off that path and into the thicket caught up with you.

We all "wander from the path" which God has carved out in the midst of this world's wilderness. We all stray into thorns and thickets, sit in seemingly lush places which turn out to be poisonous.

But we dare not take comfort from the knowledge that "all have sinned." Having plenty of company in brokenness and idolatry doesn't mean we are in good company or in a good place. It means that many are in the place of death and destruction.

Billy Graham's ministry was, at heart, dedicated to the truth that we are all trapped in sin, and but for Jesus we always would be.

In answer to this truth, Graham, and many, have preached a greater Truth: Through Jesus Christ, God has destroyed the power of sin and death over humankind. Now, we have Hope.

God sent His Son onto the path through the wilderness to seek and to save the lost. Jesus showed Himself to be "the Way, the Truth, and the Life." Through the Incarnation, Jesus even left the perfect path—Heaven—in order to reach those in misery among the thorns and poison. He Himself did not settle in those places, but reached out and took the hands and hearts of the entangled and the lost.

Kindly and lovingly, forthrightly and urgently, with whatever words or tone the situation required, Jesus called sinners from death to life and instructed us: "Follow Me!"

Our brother Billy preached this Lord, this Hope, this Way because he himself had found that the Lord welcomes those who have strayed, and offers us lifelong Help to walk on the Path with Him.

This, the Way of Life, is our comfort when we discern our straying and our sin. For us there is a Way back—repentance—and a fresh Path before us: obedience. But every path must be walked. Where does your path take you?

May our final message one day be: "Thanks be to Jesus! For He called, and I walked the true Path with Him."

Blessed Lent to you. +


