Pastor's Page

The Festival of the Resurrection was later than usual this year, so we found ourselves busy with many springtime tasks. But what a beautiful Easter morning the Lord gave us to enjoy as we remembered His triumphant victory over sin and death.

The glories of Easter continue through the "week of weeks" comprising the Church's Season of Easter, and we will continue to celebrate this Feast of Victory for our God each Sunday and, indeed, each day.

We are "People of the Resurrection," heirs of the Promise of forgiveness, new life in Christ Jesus, and understanding of the Way upon which "those who are being saved" walk each day.

Let us thank God that we are not left "in the dark" about how to live. Through the example of Jesus, the teachings of the apostles, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, The Way is not hard to find.

Though we will sometimes find it a challenge to stay on the path and not stray, experience also teaches us that God's Ways are truly the *best* of all ways, sparing us much pain and many false roads.

Instead, "because He lives, we, too, shall live"—not only "live" in the existential sense, but *live* in the fullest, most abundant sense, finding direction, purpose, value, and joy in each day God gives us, even in times of trial. We know the Risen One is, and ever shall be, with us, and we are His. Forever and ever, Amen! Christ is risen indeed!

On a more temporal note, I have been asked to provide some information to you regarding the congregation's financial situation.

For the <u>first quarter</u> of 2019, the congregation's expenditures totaled \$43,752.16. Receipts for the same quarter: \$32.893.18.

Shortfall: \$10,858.98.

For comparison purposes, in the same first quarter of 2018: expenditures, \$45,444.62; receipts, \$32,741.64.

Shortfall: \$12,703.08.

First quarter, 2017: expenditures, \$42,387.06. Receipts, \$36,986.71.

Shortfall: \$5,400.35.

While this is not the best news, two things must be noted. First, many Messiah members contribute faithfully to sustain Christ's work here. Second, laypeople in the conhave been gregation growing in their ability to serve Christ effectively, study Scripture fruitfully, and teach one another and learn together in mutually beneficial ways. Much faithful discipleship is practiced here.

One more positive note: the Hispanic Mission Church active here is growing, and in addition to providing cleaning services, is now providing \$200/month to Messiah toward expenses. They are very grateful to us, and hope to increase this offering as they are able. They are reaching people and changing lives in powerful ways.

I give thanks for every way Messiah Church is able to serve our Lord. +



The Messiah Congregation Council met on Tuesday, March 12, 2019.

- **Fellowship:** The bread and soup suppers continue every Wednesday night through April 10th. Easter breakfast tickets (\$2.00) will be sold starting March 21. These will be sold by Karen and Harry Hatt after church service.
- **Property**: Harry Hatt gave a report on seeking estimates for kitchen window replacement and parking lot improvements.
- **Volunteer Resources**: Pastor Kendall discussed that Vivian and Ray Mayopoulos will be checking the AED viability on a regular basis (making sure the batteries are still working; new pads will be paid for from the memorial fund).
- <u>Worship/Music</u>: The organist schedule was discussed in lieu of impending maternity leave for Erin Trovinger and Karen's vacation schedule.
- \$12,000 from the Joan Prestegord Bequest was approved to apply towards the roof loan principal reduction.
- Motion made and approved to transfer \$10,000 from Dorothy Daub Bequest to the General Fund.
- Motion made and approved for the Gerhard Fund to pay for a supply organist for May and October.

- It was reported that the Hispanic Congregation offered a \$200 donation to Messiah for the use of the facilities.
- It was noted that the deficit for the first quarter (Jan, Feb, March 2019) is \$10,858.85. This is income less expenses.
- Worship/Music Karen Fox reported that the organ was tuned on 4-1-19.
- Harry Hatt reported that the Surmacz family will be taking the old organ.
- Motion made and approved to accept the Turf Corps contract for lawn mowing and weed control for 2019.

Why Write Your Own Prayers?

Do you ever find yourself too tired to pray? Or is your mind too wound up, or upset or just too full of the day's plans that you can't think of what to pray? If so, Welcome to the club.

This is why after some reflection; I decided to write several prayers of my own: a morning and an evening prayer. Normally I "ad lib" most of my prayers and still do, but for help in those times when I just cannot get started on my own, there is plenty of guidance. It's not necessary to "reinvent the wheel" for many men and women of the past have written prayers for all occasions. There are prayers written in our **Lutheran Book of Worship** or other denominations' worship books like the Anglicans' **Book of Common Prayer** or non-denominational books such as **The Oxford Book of Prayer**. I attended a Presbyterian college, so I also used that denomination's book of worship. And don't forget that Bible has its own book of prayers; the Psalms by David, Asaph, the "sons of Korah" and others have been used in prayer by the Jews for millennia.

So when I decided to write a Morning Prayer and an Evening Prayer to use in my devotions, I turned to these sources among others. I wanted to include four parts in each prayer. First, thanksgiving. Many prayers I've read in the Bible and elsewhere begin with thanksgiving....and thanks for definite things, like bringing me home safely to my own bed, or for hot water for a shower (how many people don't have hot water whenever they want around the world?) or for food in the refrigerator, not to mention being adopted into God's family, for the faith to believe, for all the promises of the Bible.

Then there is confession of sins. We unhappily sin each day in various ways...some days worse than others. Again I wanted to be specific, like the grouchy thoughts I have for some irritating people at work or the impatience I may have in heavy traffic, or wandering eyes.

This is followed by prayers of intercession. I like Augustine's prayer and lifted many of the words directly from his prayer. "Keep watch, dear Lord, with those who work or watch or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, Lord Christ, give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous and all for your love's sake." Then I thought... "what of the lost and the prodigals?" and added these words of my own, "Be with those who are prodigals, seek out all the lost sheep of your flock, and return them to the fold." One can include prayers for the nation, prayers for current events, etc.

Finally prayers of intercession for me, first not to fall into sin. I liked a prayer that I found in **The Lutheran Book of Worship** and use it in my morning prayer. "Direct us in all we do and fulfill your purpose in us. This day we'll begin ventures of which we cannot see the ending, through paths as yet untrodden, through peril unknown, not knowing where we go. Give us faith to go out with GOOD COURAGE, for you have promised that you will never leave us nor forsake us" pages 136, 137 adapted. One of my greatest prayers for myself is for good courage for in our world so many have lost courage.

In my evening prayer I include a request for a peaceful night by reminding myself that my worries and fears are safe in the Lord's hands, for He is awake all night anyway and promised to take care of me in all my needs. I remember the presence of the enemy of my soul and pray for his work and power be hindered. Many people go about the night to work mischief and I pray for them to be frustrated in the pursuit of evil so that they also may be led to the Lord.

Finally, this is all to "prime the pump". Once I pray the prayers, the written prayers lead to spontaneous prayers and other subjects that the Spirit may bring to my mind that aren't written down. I'd encourage all the readers of these words to consider doing this for themselves. Doubtless you'll find prayers that I didn't find and prayers that minister more to your needs than mine. It was a good exercise that lasted about a month, a month of pondering, writing things down, erasing some of them and whipping them into a form that I liked and finally printed out to use with my Bible in daily prayers. I have collections of prayers and there are some in the library that you can use to browse through them and think about them to use in your own prayer efforts.
