Pastor's Page

Grace and peace to you from Him who is and Who was and Who is to come, Jesus Christ, our risen Lord and Savior. Amen.

As I write this brief reflection on post resurrection week, it is only fitting to contemplate on Jesus' first post appearance to His disciples. As we all are aware, Jesus' disciples were so traumatized and scared and for the fear of the Jews they confined themselves in a locked room.

The first thing Jesus offered for those frightened disciples was peace. Jesus said to them, "Peace be with you." He did that three times. To find peace in life is the most important thing, in my humble opinion. In the absence of peace, no matter how wealthy and powerful you may be, nothing would make sense. In the absence of peace, there will be no joy or happiness in life. We all do well in our daily tasks if we have peace with God, with man, and with ourselves.

What I want us to ponder here is Jesus' action. As we all heard (those of you who attended our Sunday worship service on April 24^{th)} Jesus also commissioned His disciples saying, "As the Father has sent Me, so I send you."

However, Jesus chose to set His disciples free from fear before He sent them to carry on the message of the cross.

What is Fear?

If peace, according to Leah Klemperer, is "the absence of fear and the presence of trust," fear in my understanding is the absence of both peace and trust.

If the risen Christ had not freed His disciples and breathed in them the power of the Holy Spirit, they would have remained powerless and not able to carry the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth.

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ, the same risen Lord comes to us through His Word and Sacraments offering us all the necessary spiritual food and drink to equip us for service. Like disciples, we, too, experience fear of one thing or another.

I am certain that we do not have a fear of persecution and imprisonment from our local government. Nevertheless, we have a fear of the future of our church.

Like many other churches we worry too much whether or not we could be able to maintain our church building. Captivated by fear, we are not able to strive for mission and evangelism in order to grow our church.

While I truly share your fears and frustrations, I want us to have faith in the risen Lord and learn how to trust God.

Kingdom mindset

We must have a kingdom mindset rather than be seized by fear and often ask ourselves "How much would it cost?" as opposed to how would this impact the work of the kingdom of God.

The church of our time must offer people something they cannot get from anywhere else. If the church of Jesus Christ today does not embrace or have the kingdom mindset. we would remain the same even if we have money. We don't expect to grow our church by repeating the same old habit; we don't achieve a new and better results by repeating old and outdated ways of doing things. Let us pray fervently so that we might be free from fear and move forward in the power of the Holy Spirit to do what we are called to do, that is strive to furthering the cause of the kingdom of God.

It is my hope and constant prayer that the church of Jesus Christ both here and throughout the globe will be a place where depressed people, hurting people, frustrated and confused people can find love, acceptance, help, hope, peace, forgiveness, guidance, and encouragement.

I remain servant of Christ & co-worker with you.


