I give thanks that those members who have contracted the virus have recovered (though full vitality only returns slowly). I am thankful that God has protected our health care workers in the congregation and sustained them in their important work.

I give thanks for all of vou who continue to support one another, and your congregation community, with prayer, encouragement, and continued tithes and offerings. Let us continue to "walk and not be faint." In God's good time, when the restrictions are lifted, we can enjoy full fellowship again, and will be able to look back with clear sight to see the Hand of God in our midst during these trials.

As that time has not vet come, we must continue to make adjustments in how we worship and operate. With the established provisions for perprotection sonal and spacing, we will celebrate the traditional Thanksgiving Eve liturgy this November. We will also hold the annual Congregation Meeting in person, in the nave, on the

appointed day (the third Saturday in November) at 2 PM. Please note that this year, there will be no fellowship meal or other social gathering on that day, only the meeting.

Christmas Eve will also be a bit different. After consideration, we have decided to offer both liturgies (4 PM and 7.30 PM) even though attendance is likely to be reduced due to Covid cautions. The reason for this is to allow the greatest possible safe spacing.

Unfortunately, we will not be offering a special time for children at the 4 PM liturgy, due to the necessity of safe distancing. I regret not being able to sit with the children up front and share some special time with them, but they would simply be too close to one another to be safe.

I pray that you and yours will be able to celebrate the holidays in a safe, healthy and joyful manner. Let us all pray that by this time next year, God will have delivered us from this scourge, but come what may, we know that He is, and ever will be, with us. This is the most important thing of all. ### **Protocols for Safe Worship**

- Doors are propped open before worship so fewer people will handle the door handles.
- Pews are marked at proper "physical distancing" intervals, with everyother-row seating including, if necessary, the choir loft as an "overflow space."
- Offering plates are placed beside Communion cup trays to receive Sunday offering.



• All worshipers and worship leaders are asked to wear masks except during the sermon and to receive the Sacrament for the foreseeable future.

- Everyone will refrain from shaking hands or hugging during sharing of the Peace, while greeting each other or taking their leave from one another.
- Remember, if you cough or sneeze, to do so in the crook of your arm with your head tilted away from others. Wash your hands after you use the restroom. Restroom doors are propped open.

Please take an ornament from the tree, purchase your gift/gifts and return them to the church <u>unwrapped</u>.


The Social Ministry Committee has applied for a grant from Thrivent to help defray the costs of larger items.


