What comes in November?

The American Thanksgiving holiday (Canada's is a different date). Are you looking forward to the smells and tastes and other pleasures of the holiday?

Family gatherings. *Will* you travel? *Will* others travel to you? *Will* you get to see loved ones from far away?

Fallen leaves and frost. *Is* raking in your future? Will you be troubled by the chill, or relieved to enjoy a warm bed?

Planning for Christmas and New Year's. Making travel reservations? Christmas lists? Resolving to be less material, and more spiritual, about the season?

What else?

Word and Sacrament at your church, each week. Do you nourish your soul, or is it on a starvation diet? Do you hunger for God, or prefer other "food" than His? Do you love His people through your presence and encouragement and prayers? Reading your Bible. The Bible Covenant continues with Isaiah. It's not too late to start, but remember to keep going if you're in the Covenant already—it's easy to get busy!

The Annual Congregation Meeting. Third Saturday in November. Important matters to consider. Also, a cultural opportunity: you can learn to make chicken pot pie under the guidance of experts, all on the same day.

Increased demands on social services and community organizations. Have you sponsored a Thanksgiving dinner at the Rescue Mission or Agape House, or volunteered some time and energy on behalf of the less fortunate so that they, too, will know that someone cares?

Deployed troops. Soldiers, sailors, airmen, marines, coasties, many thousands are serving both nearby and far away so that we can enjoy the benefits of their protection. Will you remember them in prayer, offer thanks and encouragement to their families, and strive for real justice and peace in the earth?

Children watching adults. They always do.
