Pastor's Page

The apostle Paul wrote: "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."

That law is the New Commandment given by our Lord on Maundy Thursday: *Love one another as I have loved you*.

This month I'm asking you to take up this Commandment in a particular way.

I am asking everyone who is able to hear God's call to "love one another" to respond to that call by offering to visit with at least one of those I've described here on a regular basis. You will come to them as a Christian friend bringing the precious gift of the Love of Christ.

You might visit someone you've known for a long time, or someone you have only known by name or by sight. The main thing is, <u>they will have a</u> <u>visitor.</u> Someone whose presence shows that they are remembered, by God and by their brother or sister in faith.

Your visit would bring the Good News to them in a tangible, blessed way: you will be *living proof* that

however their life has changed, God's love, and agape love, still find them.

Only those who have experienced the loneliness of immobility, or isolation, or diminished health and reduced social opportunities, can know how great a blessing it is to be remembered and visited AS a friend, BY a friend.

Sometimes, it takes a CHRISTIAN friend to remind us, in the midst of hard challenges, that life is still a blessing; that joys still come.

Will you be such a messenger of loving reminder? I hope you'll prayerfully consider saying YES.

To help you get started, on the first and second Sundays in Advent we'll gather during the Living in Faith hour to talk about what people experience in times of "diminishing change," and how to be prepared to minister to such folks as a visiting friend.

The blessings of such a ministry are not only for the one visited. Only God knows, now, what blessings you also will receive. Say "Yes!" and find out! +

The Messiah Congregation Council met on Tuesday, October 10, 2017.

- Harry Hatt presented the display board for the Atlantic Mission District Convocation in Camp Hill this weekend.
- A sign-up sheet is located on the Information Board requesting cookies for the annual Advent shut-in distribution.
- A sign-up sheet is located on the Information Center for the Spaghetti Miracle to be held on Saturday, November 18 at noon, to be followed by the annual congregation meeting at 2 PM.
- The Finance Committee recommended the 2018 Ministry Plan, with a needed congregation vote to modify the Pastor's Letter of Call for a reduction in salary for 2018.
- The Tree of Giving for the Agape Shelter will go up at the end of October requesting simple gifts for mother and children residing at the Agape Shelter. Harry Hatt applied for and has received matching funds from Thrivent to benefit the Agape Shelter.
- Harry Hatt and Rita Savant have agreed to run for a second term to serve on Congregation Council. Charlotte Varone is completing her third 2-year term and is ineligible to run. The committee will be talking to other congregation members interested in serving on Congregation Council.
