Pastor's Page

I like to read the verses of hymns as part of my personal devotional practice. I take a little time with this, and do it in a setting that is quiet—interruptions break my train of concentration and don't allow thoughts to take shape and connect to one another.

Sometimes I read a hymn out loud, and learn from giving expression to the text with voice rather than music. I might spend time reflecting upon just one verse, even one line.

Often, I marvel that words written centuries ago are still so timely: relevant to a current situation, or to spiritual questions confronting me.

This shouldn't really be surprising. A good hymn is always based on Biblical truth, and the Bible is always timely. A good hymn is also the writer's attempt to put into words some aspect of his or her faith experience, struggles, joys, insights and crosses borne. When we read the words of a hymn, we are being shown the thoughts, and the heart, of the writer.

Sometimes that writer speaks for all of us in the Body of Christ, and the hymn is phrased as a collective expression, using "We" and "us," or as an address to the whole Church (for instance, "Rise Up, O Saints of God"). Sometimes, the hymn depicts a conversation, or words addressed to Christ from one of His servants: "You have come down to the lakeshore ..."

Sometimes a hymn is very personal, asking for divine Aid to become a better Child of God: "Take My Heart, and Let It Be/Consecrated, Lord, to Thee." Or, in the midst of fear or sorrow, asking for God's steadfast Companionship in the dark nights of life: "Abide with Me, Fast Falls the Eventide."

Sometimes, the words of a hymn move us to look at our situation in life or our outlook on life, and help us find—or remember—a better place than where we are.

For example, as we wearily listen to more rhetoric from President wannabe's, or watch yet another Harrisburg budget feud,

hear of another murder, or sigh while trying to decipher yet another change in our health insurance, we contend with the temptation to sink into hopelessness.

A line from the hymn "God of Grace and God of Glory" recently spoke to me: Save us from weak resignation To the evils we deplore; Let the gift of Your salvation be our glory evermore. Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, serving You Whom we adore, serving You Whom we adore.

No matter how selfserving, broken or corrupt we might perceive earthly institutions to be, these things will pass away, and our inner peace does not (and never will) depend on them.

This hymn text reminded me of our true hope. Our peace, contentment, purpose, and strength are found as we devote ourselves to the One Whom we adore.

Our hymns celebrate God's Truths. Invest some of your time with them, and let them encourage you too. +
