Pastor's Page

I'd like to thank everyone who has been coming for Sunday worship. The virus situation has reminded us how blessed we are when we can gather together to worship God, and encourage each other simply by being together.

I also want to commend those who prayerfully considered what to do about "in person" gatherings in light of personal health factors. Those of you who are exercising caution by remaining at home for health reasons are exercising faithful stewardship of God's gift of life, and your decision is understandable.

I'm glad we have been able to provide, via email, Sunday worship resources for you. I hope they are helping you to retain a sense of participation with your brothers and sisters in faith on Sunday mornings.

We have also had to prayerfully consider what to do in regard to our gatherings. Especially in light of changing state requirements for inperson gatherings, we have had to calculate maximum permissible numbers, spacing, and personal protection. We monitor this in an ongoing way so that we can demonstrate our conformity with government requirements in the event that our in-person gatherings are questioned or challenged at any time by the authorities.

I have saved several news articles concerning prescribed safe practices and requirements, and we match our policies with these. Recently on a Sunday I had to ask everyone to wear their mask as prescribed (covering mouth and nose) because this is the requirement put forth by the Department of Health.

In a newspaper article, I subsequently learned that hospitals and medical centers are allowing those who cannot, for health reasons, cover mouth and nose to wear a full-face visor instead. I saved this article and so we are "covered" if anyone chooses to attend worship wearing a visor rather than a mask.

There has been a lot of fussing nationwide about mask requirements. They are uncomfortable (especially in the hot and humid weather we've had this summer) and I know from experience that they reduce blood-oxygen saturation (mine went from 99% to 94% due to the mask).

Masks were also required during the "Spanish Flu" pandemic a century ago, when the population was much smaller than it is today. That pandemic lasted for 35 months. I hope we will not be encumbered for that long this time, but remembering that there still is no vaccine for the virus which causes the common cold. I don't think we can assume that an effective vaccine will arrive by Christmas. We'll see.

To me as a Christian, my course is clear. The command to "love your neighbor" is unequivocal. Since masks both protect and reassure those around us from our potential germs, the most faithful thing to

do is simply to wear your mask when it's necessary.

People are under so much stress these days, I figure that if I can lessen the stress of another by keeping my mask on, this is a God-pleasing thing to do.

It also occurred to me to be thankful, for some masks available today (especially the blue or yellow "hospital kind") are more effective than any masks were in 1919.

So we are better protected, and can protect each other better, than was the case back then.

Let us remember to care for ourselves, and each other, and to be constant in prayer that God will deliver us from this deadly pestilence, and from every kind of evil. Stay safe. *Pastor* +


Baptisms in the Swatara

Protocols for Safe Worship

- Doors are propped open before worship so fewer people will handle the door handles.
- Pews are marked at proper "physical distancing" intervals, with everyother-row seating including, if necessary, the choir loft as an "overflow space."



- Offering plates are placed beside Communion cup trays to receive Sunday offering.
- All worshipers and worship leaders are asked to wear masks except during the sermon and to receive the Sacrament for the foreseeable future.
- Everyone will refrain from shaking hands or hugging during sharing of the Peace, while greeting each other or taking their leave from one another.
- Remember, if you cough or sneeze, to do so in the crook of your arm with your head tilted away from others. Wash your hands after you use the restroom. Restroom doors are propped open.



Annual Congregation Meeting



Reminder: The annual congregation meeting will be held in person on Satur-

At this meeting we will be

electing new Congregation Council members for 2021, going over the proposed Ministry Plan for 2021, and discussing other church business.

Active (voting) membership is defined by our Constitution as making **four Communions of record** (completing the Communion record card when you receive Holy Communion) and **one contribution of record** to Messiah (use your envelopes when making your offering at Messiah) in the current calendar year.



Annual Atlantic Mission Region Convocation

Once again, the pandemic has created problems. Due to the large geographic spread of the Atlantic Mission Region the decision was made to have the AMR annual October Convocation be held virtually this year for the safety of all.

Therefore, the AMR Convocation will be held on **Saturday, October 17 ONLY** via Go to Meeting teleconference. Log on time is 8:30 AM with a start time of 9 AM. It will run through noon.

The business meeting will be as short as possi-

ble. After that we have an exciting presenter who will stir us up and equip us to serve as disciples of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

As of this publication, the topic and structure of

the Convocation is still being reworked as we changed topic when the decision was made to be virtual. Much more information and registration materials will be available SOON! Watch your bulletin!

Report from the 2020 NALC Convocation

The NALC Mission Convocation was held online because of health concerns resulting from the coronavirus pandemic. The convocation met in two sessions August 7 & 8. Each day began with a devotional message on the theme from Ephesians 3:20-21. Bishop Selbo began the convocation on Friday and the Rev. Dr. Gemechis Buba, assistant to the bishop for missions, began Saturday's sessions.

There were 267 lay delegates, 300 clergy delegates and 217 visitors registered for the convocation.

The convocation was live streamed from the Trinity School for Ministry campus in Ambridge, PA, where the Seminary Center of the North American Lutheran Seminary is located.

"This will go down as the best online convocation we have had over our 10 years of history. I think that's wonderful. It may also go down, and probably will, as the worst online convocation we have had in our 10 years of history. Either way, it's all good," Bishop Selbo said.

The best was evident in the possibility of NALC members from across North America meeting together using online communication tools. The worst manifested itself in technical difficulties that made it difficult for some delegates to be heard and in the difficulty of estimating the time the convocation would take. Each online vote took between five and fifteen minutes. The Saturday session lasted three hours longer than planned.

In addition to presenting the 2020 Vision (see page 11), Bishop Selbo gave a report of his first year as bishop. The online convocation heard reports—both live and prerecorded—from NALC ministries including Youth and Family Ministry, Life-to-Life Discipleship, Living and Giving Stewardship Team, NALC Life Ministries, Women of the NALC, NALC Disaster Response, and Missions.

Significant anniversaries of ordination and of the founding of congregations were recognized. The convocation also recognized newly ordained pastors and students in the NALC's candidacy process. Chaplains were also recognized.

The convocation received the treasurer's report and approved budgets for the NALC Operating Fund, Theological Education Fund, Great Commission Fund and Disaster Response Fund.

The convocation approved proposed amendments to the NALC constitution that will move the NALC from meeting annually for its convocation to meeting every other year.

The convocation voted to add language to the proposed amendments asking that the NALC Executive Council to provide quarterly updates to pastors and congregations.

The convocation also approved a proposed amendment to clarify the process by which the Executive Council apportions additional lay delegates to the convocation so that there is approximately an equal number of lay and clergy delegates.

Amendments approved by the convocation must be ratified within six months of the conclusion of the convocation by a two-thirds majority of NALC congregations voting on the amendments. At least half of NALC congregations must vote on whether or not to ratify the amendments for the ratification vote to be valid. Information on the ratification process will be available soon.

NALC 2020 Vision: A 10-Point Plan

"A 2020 Vision for the North American Lutheran Church" was endorsed by the 2020 NALC Mission Convocation. The Rev. Dan Selbo, NALC bishop, presented the 10-point vision to the convocation which met online August 7-8.

"The title itself—a 2020 Vision—is a little bit of a play on words. I'm playing with the fact that we're in the year 2020... It's also as clear a vision as we currently have—20-20—for where we believe God is leading," Bishop Selbo said.

"The rationale for this vision perhaps goes unsaid, but I believe it's worth saying: 'Unless the Lord builds the house, those who built it labor in vain.' We are trusting that this vision is not simply of our making but one that is given to us by God. And 'without a vision the people perish.' That's a paraphrase of one of the passages of Scripture. But it's true. We need direction if we're going to survive and move forward and grow. A vision is crucial."

"It is not my desire to move us in any new and radical directions... It is my desire to keep us moving. And if we don't know where we're going, it's going to be hard to get there," Bishop Selbo said.

The Convocation approved a resolution endorsing "the direction that the 2020 Vision sets for the entire NALC for the next four years." The resolution also asks the NALC "to commit to fervent daily prayer and action for the 2020 Vision to come to life in and among us" and "to encourage collaboration of all disciples, congregations and entities of the NALC in implementing Vision 2020."

The resolution called for annual reports and "frequent updates on how the 2020 Vision is coming to life in individual discipleship, congregational renewal, mission district initiatives, with our mission partners, global and ecumenical partners, and throughout this church body."

The NALC 2020 Vision: A 10-Point Plan

- 1. A church body committed to developing disciple-making congregations and cultures.
- 2. A body of believers committed to increasing our mission outreach and congregation multiplication efforts.
- 3. A denomination in which every congregation receives regular and consistent pastoral support.
- 4. A continuing education emphasis that supports the ongoing development of all NALC pastors and lay leaders.
- 5. A strategy for continental restructuring that is able to expand with denominational growth.
- 6. A denomination with the strongest and most highly respected Lutheran seminary training system in North America.
- 7. A communications strategy focused on forming identity, unity and testimony across our church body.
- 8. A denomination in which our international and ecumenical relationships strengthen our shared commitment to the Great Commission, the Great Commandments and the Church catholic, and which enhance our partnership on the congregational level.
- 9. A church body with the financial strength to support its God-given vision.
- 10. A Strategic Planning Team (SPT) that continually prays for and works to develop the next steps for our God-given vision and future.




