Pastor's Page

Two months ago, with the government indicating that the worst of C19 looked to be over, I wrote optimistically about celebrating a “Return to Worship Rally Day” at Messiah on Sunday, September 12.

Now we are hearing of mandatory vaccinations to “stop the spread,” renewed concerns about masking, warnings about indoor gatherings and, in general, renewed uncertainty about the pandemic.

At Messiah, Congregation Council recently voted to lift the requirement for non-vaccinated persons to wear masks in worship (for maximum safety and worshipers’ confidence, Assisting Ministers continue to mask during distribution of Holy Communion elements).

When the pandemic was first widely publicized in March 2020, I researched the so-called “Spanish Flu” in the early 20th Century, and learned that pandemic lasted for 35 months. To help prepare you for what might occur

with the C19 pandemic, I shared this information with you.

It has become clear that no one and no agency can predict with confidence how long the pandemic will last. We must all make the most prudent decisions for our health and wellbeing, and for the safety of our neighbors.

We will proceed as planned with our “Rally Day,” and I invite everyone to return to “in-person” worship together on Sunday, 9/12.

However, in light of recent developments with Covid, if you decide the best course for you right now is to stay at home instead of coming to worship for health reasons, everyone will understand. The emailed worship resources will still be available. I do ask you to hold your congregation and all our people in your prayers, asking especially that God will make it safe for all believers to gather for worship as soon as He wills.

If you do come on Sunday

the 12th, the Fellowship Committee will provide a “Welcome Time” after worship. We hope that everyone will use this time to “catch up” with one another and enjoy companionship as Christian brothers and sisters.

Please continue to pray for health care workers. Many of these dedicated people are being pressured to receive vaccinations in order to keep working, or are being penalized in financial and other ways if they decline vaccinations for personal health reasons. This is unjust, but is increasingly a sign of the troubling times in which we live. Pray for these, and for all health care and emergency services providers.

Finally, let us all remember God’s Promises in Scripture, which transcend all times and situations. I find this one especially encouraging for many reasons:

Surely He will deliver you from the snare of the fowler, and from the deadly pestilence.

Amen! Peace to you all. +

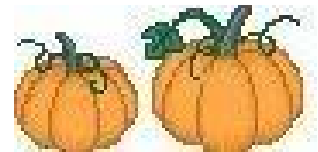


August Congregation Council Highlights

Report from the 2021 NALC Convocation

The 2021 NALC Mission Convocation heard updates on the 10 points of the NALC's *2020 Vision* and overwhelmingly approved two resolutions supporting decisions by the Executive Council to establish a central NALC office in the Dallas-Fort Worth, Texas, area and to add four part-time assistants to the bishop.

The convocation revolved around the 10 points of the *2020 Vision*. Each vision point was highlighted with oral and written reports. Opportunities for discussion of each point and questions from delegates were provided.

More than 400 delegates and visitors gathered August 4-6 in Corpus Christi, Texas, for the 2021 Mission Convocation around the theme, "God the Father Creates." The convocation and the events preceding it comprise the NALC's annual Lutheran Week.

2020 Vision Appeal: We are excited to share that we are moving forward with funding and implementing our *2020 Vision* with the full support of the bishop and Executive Council. We are working with Cramer & Associates from Dublin, Ohio, a Christian-based philanthropic advisory firm, to execute this powerful and important initiative. We look forward to communicating and working with you on building our future.

Elections: The Rev. Mark Werner of Pittsgrove, New Jersey, and Joel Williams of Erwin, South Dakota, were elected to four-year terms on the Executive Council. The Rev. Dr. Jeffray Greene of Brooks, Georgia, and Matthew Lind of Bainbridge Island, Washington, were elected to the Court of Adjudication.

The Rev. Dr. Amy Little was installed as the General Secretary of the NALC. The general secretary is the chief operating officer of the NALC and manages its administrative functions.

A major address on the convocation theme, "God the Father Creates," was delivered by the Rev. Dr. Steven Paulson. He focused on the significance of the first article of the Apostles' Creed and Martin Luther's explanation of it in his Small Catechism.

Melissa Ohden told the moving story of her life as the survivor of a failed saline infusion abortion and now as an advocate for abortion survivors and pro-life policies.

2022 budgets were approved. The Convocation approved a \$2 million Operating Budget for the NALC. Budgets were also approved for the church's designated funds: \$875,000 for the Theological Education Fund (which includes the North American Lutheran Seminary); \$215,500 for the Great Commission Fund; and \$143,000 for the Disaster Response Fund.

Prayer for Ethiopia: The convocation unanimously approved a resolution inviting NALC pastors, congregations and members to unite in "intentional and intensive prayer for Ethiopia." Ethiopia is going through a time of significant political unrest. The NALC is in a full-communion relationship with the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus, the largest Lutheran church in the world.

Amendments to the NALC Constitution adding language naming mission districts and mission regions were approved. The amendments must be ratified by NALC congregations.

Reports of the work of the NALC's staff, teams, task forces, ministries and ministry partners were warmly received.

The Braaten-Benne Lectures in Theology, which preceded the convocation, focused on God the Father. Other events of Lutheran week included the Women of the NALC Annual Gathering and workshops on discipleship, stewardship and youth ministry.
