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# Pastor's Page

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matt. 11: 28-30).

Considering Jesus' bidding to come to his rest, it is my earnest hope and prayer as your interim pastor to come to the house of worship and be part of the faith community here at Messiah Lutheran Church. We are not called to walk on our faith journey alone but to walk alongside with our sisters and brothers.

Life is full of risks and challenges for all of us. But I want to speak about the risks and challenges our young adults face in this constantly changing and restless world.

The challenges young adults face are much greater when the economic and political situation has become more and more unstable. Young adults are ill prepared for the transition from a supportive and protective home or school environment to independent living. How do they realize the rest which Jesus promises when they are confronted by: Hopelessness, Fear, Loneliness, and Despair. Here, I want to high light few things which I believe would be very helpful

Young adults are very susceptible to the tyranny of the "Urgent" more so than anybody else. What do I mean by "the urgent?" We are often challenged by either the urgent in our lives or the important in our lives. These two things are always in opposition to each other. However, both are not equally noisy and pushy to say the least.

The urgent of "here and now, immediate gratification" forces its demand on our lives. The urgent in your life, whatever it may be, will fight and scream for your attention; to be self-sufficient, to be attractive, to be popular, to be accepted, and to be wanted.

These misguided desires lure us into the belief that we will be happier and content if only we have them at any cost with less effort. All the junk that is accumulated in our lives from our childhood to adulthood needs to be "Detoxed" like drug. How can we do that? How can especially young adults cope with the tyranny of urgent? How do we find rest in this restless world? How do we find direction in aimless world? How do we find hope amid hopelessness?

Jesus is offering a practical solution. He is calling us back to himself and helps us to see the "Important" for our lives.

Concerning his soul, the psalmist says: Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation.

(Psalm 42: 5).

Remember! Jesus is calling and promising for all whose souls are weary and burdened. Jesus promises rest for the soul. Jesus is offering comfort for those who are afflicted. Jesus is offering rest. But you must come to Jesus and do what he asks you to do.

What is it Jesus asking us to do? Take up his yoke and learn from him. Why are Jesus' yoke and burden different from all other yokes and burdens I carry? The answer is that: Jesus is gentle and humble, his yoke is easy, his burden is light, and he gives rest for my soul. When our mind is set on Christ: Our priorities change, our understanding of money changes, our understanding of our world changes, the values of our friendship changes, our values of marriage changes, we find a clear direction for our lives.





# Highlights from the 2022 NALC Convocation

Hosted by the North American Lutheran Seminary

August 5, 2022

The 2022 Mission Convocation has ended after more than 400 delegates and visitors gathered online to celebrate another year of ministry and mission in the North American Lutheran Church (NALC).

The biggest highlight came this year in the form of the 2022 NALC Ministry Report video, which celebrated the growth of the NALC in a little over a decade, while also reporting on its work in the past year and sharing where it is headed in the next season. The full video, located online, touched on:

- Congregations and pastors which have recently joined the NALC;
- New mission starts as well as local, domestic, and global mission strategies;
- Newly appointed area assistants to the bishop and progress on the centralized office in the Dallas/Ft. Worth, Texas area;
- The growing North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS) network of schools, faculty transitions, and a special call for congregations to raise up new ministry leaders;
- Expanding candidacy pathways, including the initiation of the NALC diaconate and "Ordination Under Special Circumstances" (OUSC), as well as pastoral care opportunities in small congregations;
- "Fresh Eyes for Mission" renewal summits, Renewal and Aging Ministry online courses, and NALC Life-t o-Life Discipleship resources;
- Youth and Family Ministry transitions:
- Ongoing Disaster Response efforts;
- Continued Communication Ministry growth in mission districts;
- Launch of the Today, Tomorrow & Forever initiative;
- And snapshots of many other NALC ministries.

The NALC officially launched the Today, Tomorrow & Forever initiative of its 2020 Vision. This is the financial component to the NALC strategic plan that will provide the resources needed to turn this Godgiven Vision into a reality. Through this initiative, the NALC is asking pastors, congregations, mission districts, and individuals throughout the church to step out in faith and to help it to raise \$5 million above and beyond what it is already expecting to receive through regular giving over the next three years. This increased level of funding will not only strengthen the financial foundation of the church but will also enable a number of ministry and mission commitments we are making.

**Elections:** Mr. Jerry Roehr of Winnipeg, Manitoba, and the Rev. Theresa Jacobson of Thornville, Ohio, were elected to three-year terms on the Executive Council. The Rev. Dr. George Black of Foresthill, California, and the Rev. Ronald Hoyum of Poulsbo, Washington, were elected to three-year terms on the Court of Adjudication. Mrs. Lynnae Douglas of Export, Pennsylvania, the Rev. Dr. Stephane M. Kalonji of Rosenberg, Texas, and Mr. Richard Jansak of Hendersonville, North Carolina, were elected to five-year terms on the Executive Council.

A devotion on the Mission Convocation theme, "A Great Cloud of Witnesses" (Hebrews 12:1-3) was delivered by Dr. David Luy, the new Associate Professor of Systematic Theology at the NALS. Dr. Luy's devotion highlighted the radical path to faithfulness, a call to endurance and perseverance, and a witness that points beyond what we see to what is real.

**The 2023 budget was approved.** The Mission Convocation approved a \$3.56 million budget for the ministry of the NALC. The 2023 unified budget combines the operating budget with the budgets of the church's designated funds – the Theological Education Fund (which includes the North American Lutheran Seminary), Great Commission Fund and Disaster Response Fund.

Per the NALC Constitution, the Executive Council also gave a report for the past year.
