## Pastor's Page

The Kendalls were on vacation as the newsletter deadline arrived, so this month's pastoral message was prepared ahead of time.

As we travel, garden, sip tea on the porch and do whatever else the summer months allow, here are a few things to remember, and act upon accordingly:

- Christian worship, fellowship, Word and Sacraments are provided us by God every Sunday at 9 AM. Care for your soul by availing yourself of these.
- "Stories for God's People" will be provided in July and August during the Living in Faith hour each Sunday except the fourth Sunday (Bible Covenant Sunday). You are welcome to bring your children's friends.
- If you are physically able, please offer some time and effort to care for the grounds and interior of God's House. There are areas available for the 2017 growing season; you are welcome to contact those already signed up and offer them your help in their plot.
- The Biblical "tithe" is <u>ten percent</u> of what we

receive from God. In case you wonder, Pastor and Carey give a tithe of their gross income. If you have concerns about sufficiency, a tithe of your net income instead is a good starting place, or goal for you to work toward. The "tithe" is not a re-quirement for people of faith, but it is a valuable reference point for us in beginning to define "appropriate" or "sacrificial" giving.

- If you have extraordinary expenses related to health, housing or other life necessities, God understands the importance of prudence.
- It is a spiritual discipline for us to effectively distinguish "needs" as opposed to "wants" and to order our life priorities accordingly.
- If you have the opportunity to do something nice with a friend, take it. Neither opportunities nor friends last forever, and both are blessings.
- Find specific things to give thanks for every day.
- Remember that God is always with us; remember that *we* are in the best situation if *we*

are also with God.

- Travel safely, return refreshed, don't be in a hurry.
- Remember to be kind to waitresses, store clerks and public servants. They work hard and are not always treated well.
- Consider the Bible part of your "summer reading"—indeed, the *best* part. Read at least a Psalm daily, and don't stop there.
- When you see someone with a problem, pray for them. If someone is disturbing you, pray for that person before becoming angry.
- Exercise patience; as with anything else, exercise produces greater strength in the thing exercised.
- Eat fresh fruit and vegetables.
- In a heat wave, invite someone without air conditioning to a sleepover and a day or two with you.
- Remember not to leave pets, children, or chocolate in your car in summertime.

Have a faithful, peaceful, safe and pleasant summer. We will look for you on Sundays and be glad to see you. Peace to you from your Pastor. + Summer vacation is a great break for everyone. But the needs of the church never take a vacation. Please remember your offerings, gifts and tithes to Messiah when you are on vacation. Thank you.
