Years ago, I had the distinct honor and pleasure of meeting Pastor Barry. We shared the Lutheran background, a dedication to firefighting and fire safety education. We also had an interest in military history. We spoke often, live on the phone as well as e-mail.

Saturday night at about 9 pm, I would receive the "scriptures", etc., for the next day (Sunday). Then, on Tuesday, we would talk to discuss the "sermon" and other events. This process lasted for many/many months.

He had that Aire of understanding about him. Evenings and some afternoon phone talks occurred often (weekly).

He had a sensitivity that was so real, it was, at times, emotionally moving to me. He never criticized what I had done or didn't do in my 76 years. He always found positive things God made and that I did.

This is a letter of appreciation to God and Jesus for placing Barry in my life "forever." I reflect daily on meaningful conversations we had over the years.

I thank God for Barry in my life. He is with the Lord where he will rest in peace forever.
