Advent Season is a very special time of year that sometimes gets lost in the bright lights of the Christmas season it precedes. The first day of Advent is the first day of a new Liturgical (or church) calendar and begins a four week period of preparation for the nativity of Jesus Christ at Christmas.

The Advent Season is all about reflecting on how we can prepare our hearts and homes for Christ's birth in the world as it is today. It is a time for faith communities and families to remember, through prayer, reflections, special music, and good deeds what the true meaning of Jesus' birth is.

The Advent season invites us to step away from what can be a frenzied time of parties, shopping, and holiday noise to consider how we remember the birth of Jesus, one of the holiest times in Christian faith. It is also a time to reflect on the triumphant return of Jesus at the second coming. This year we are going to use a hymn that we haven't sung for a number of years, AND learn a new hymn.

The first hymn is *Light* One Candle to Watch for Messiah, WOV 630. Each week **before** we sing the psalm, we will sing the appropriate verse while the advent wreath is lit. Advent 1, verse 1, Advent 2, verse 2, and so on. On the fourth Sunday in Advent we will sing the fourth and last verse before we sing the psalm. I've mentioned this to a few people and they were eager to sing this hymn once again.



DECEMBER, 2023

At first glance it seems confusing. The hymn sounds more like a Lenten hymn than an Advent hymn. It talks about events of Lent and Easter. BUT, Advent is also about the second coming of Christ. We remember both the arrival of Baby Jesus and then Second coming of Christ. Don't worry if you are confused at this point. You are not alone.



Next is learning a new hymn. During the Advent season we will learn a new hymn. We will sing it each of the four weeks in Advent, somewhere in the liturgy. The hymn is LBW 27, Lo, He Comes with Clouds Descending. Interestingly, this is the only Advent hymn we have not learned to sing in both the LBW and WOV.



We know that Christ was born, ministered to the people of the earth, was crucified, died and was raised. He ascended into heaven and we await His return. This hymn covers all of that and maybe gives us a different perspective on this Advent.

This addendum has been added below the 2024 Ministry Plan to show the amount of money the congregation will receive from the AMR for the purchasing of administrative services from Messiah. Congregation Council approved the purchasing of administrative services from Messiah at a specially called Council meeting on Sunday, October 24, 2023.

Notes for 2024 Ministry Plan

- 1. Pastor's salary and housing line item amounts were increased by 3%, which also increases Pastor's Social Security line item.
- 2. The committee has proposed \$18.00/hour for the Office Manager's salary. Robin was only getting paid \$14.00/hour after 13 years of service, so the new rate better reflects her years of service and her responsibilities. The Social Security line item increases as a result of the increased salary.
- 3. Technology support was reinstated for this coming year, which reflects services purchased for upgrading Messiah's Website.
- 4. The increases for each of these line items reflect the increased costs because of inflation.
- 5. The Speakers & Substitutes line item is increased to reflect the continued need for supply pastors.
- 6. **Benevolence Breakdown for 2024:** The Benevolence line item was increased to better reflect the 10% tithe of the congregation. The Council recommends the following benevolence amounts for 2024 as follows:
 - 1. NALC \$8400 per year or \$700 each month (6.65%)
 - 2. Atlantic Mission District \$1200.00 per year or \$100 per month (.9%)
 - 3. NALC Partner Ministries (\$500 divided \$125.00 per quarter (.35%)):
 - a. Lutheran Military Veterans and Families Ministries
 - b. The Great Commission Society
 - c. Water Missions International
 - d. Lutheran Bible Translators
 - 4. North American Lutheran Seminary- (\$500 divided \$125.00 per quarter) (.35%)
 - 5. Independent Church in India (\$500 divided \$125.00 per quarter) (.35%)
 - 6. Caring Cupboard (\$500 divided \$125.00 per quarter) (.35%)
 - 7. Lebanon Free Clinic (\$500 divided \$95.00 \$125.00 per quarter) (.35%)
 - 8. Lebanon Rescue/Agape (\$500 divided \$125.00 per quarter) (.35%)
 - 9. City of Lebanon (in lieu of taxes) (\$500 divided \$125.00 per quarter) (.35%)

TOTAL Estimated Benevolence Giving: \$13,100 (represents 10% of 2024 estimated giving)**

Please note: Lutheran World Relief - has been removed from benevolence giving because it is no longer recognized as a ministry partner of the NALC. The delegates and clergy at the NALC Convocation in Oklahoma voted to stop sending funds to LWR because of its position supporting abortion.

** In December of each year, the treasurer and assistant treasurer will review offerings given for the year to determine if there are additional offerings to send to each organization based upon the congregation's 10.00% tithe. The additional offerings will be divided according to the percentages listed above and sent to each organization with the December check.
