Easter Blessings

Spoiler Alert - You will be reading this April newsletter article before the celebration of the Resurrection, but it's going to be about Easter. So with that being said, "CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!" What a truly joyous reason for celebrating God's Gift of Eternal Life for each and every one of His believers.

"For I know that my Redeemer lives." (Job 19:25)

Job is presumed by many to be the oldest book in the Bible. And the oldest of books has to do with the oldest of problems: "Why do the righteous suffer?" Up to this verse in the story of Job, he is asking tough questions. "Man dies, and is laid low; man breathes his last and where he?' (14:10). "If man dies, shall he live again?" (14:14). They were unanswerable questions back then, which rose from a troubled and anguished heart. But with his cry of faith, "I know that my Redeemer lives," Job is on solid ground.

Job is led by the Spirit to make the statement of assurance for believers down through the centuries. He says, "I know." He points with certainty to the fact that the solution to all problems, and the ultimate answer to all questions, whether they be old and persistent or new and passing, lies in knowing that the Lord, our Redeemer, lives! Christ has conquered the last great enemy, which is death. He is "declared to be the Son of God with power ... by the resurrection from the dead" (Romans 1:4).

God's plan for us is that by the testimony of the Holy Spirit, and by opening one's eyes to see the innumerable evidences of God's power and authority in the world of nature and human history, we may come to a place where we can say WE KNOW!


God's agenda is that we come to know HIM! This is why the Holy Scriptures were given to us; so that we might know by the Holy

Spirit that we have been granted eternal life through the death and resurrection of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We do not guess. We do not suppose. We do not wish. We do not wonder. We know!


