#### "How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts." Psalm 84:1

God has made a lovely dwelling place here at Messiah Lutheran Church. I see the Lord dwelling among his people here by the power of the Holy Spirit who draws us all together. You are the blessed people of God and I see in your worship and fellowship and study of scripture the liveliness that is the mark of God's work among you. Thank you for welcoming Pastor Paul and I to your congregation. We have felt very much at home.

I was asked to tell you a little about myself and my role here at Messiah Lutheran Church for the next couple of months. I grew up in Johnstown, PA and did my undergraduate at Indiana University of PA and my seminary at Gettysburg (where I met my husband, Paul.) My father was a steel worker and my mother was a store clerk for JC Penney. I am the youngest of 5 children. I have been a pastor for 33 years.

I began my ministry as an associate pastor at Grace Lutheran Church in Rochester, PA. After a short time there my husband and I felt called to work together and we accepted a joint call to Faith Lutheran Church in

Shell Rock, Iowa where we ministered for almost 7 years. Most recently we served together at Saint Paul Lutheran Church on Trinity Road in York for 24 years, retiring in November of 2023. We are the parents . William of our son (married to Alvssa) who works for Millersville University. They have three children: Charlotte (9), Lucy (7) and Noah (4) and they live in York. We also have a daughter Laura (married to Christopher) and she works for Johns Hopkins University. They have two children: Maci (9) and Max (5) and they live in Gettysburg.

One of the reasons we retired (besides reaching retirement age!) is that we wanted to be available for either babysitting or attending sporting events for our little brood. That explains why I agreed to a very part-time role here at Messiah.

Having said that you should know that I have had a very hands on ministry over the years and I hope to give this congregation as much attention as I possibly can considering the limitations imposed by my family obligations.

The schedule that I have worked out with the Congregation Council is that I will be in Lebanon one weekday each week. That will usually be Tuesday, but if I have to change days it will always be on a day when Robin is also present in the office. I will also preach twice a month on a four Sunday month and three times a month on a five Sunday month. This agreement is for six months starting May 1. I will attend Congregation Council meetings and will be available for consultation for other committees as well.

One of the things I hope to do is visit the members of the congregation in their homes. These will be approximately one hour visits and I hope to simply get to know you and pray with you. It will take me a while to get around and if you would rather just have a phone call just say so when I call to make an appointment with you. We could also meet at the church if you would rather not have me come to your home. My priority will be the shut-ins and anyone with current health or family issues. But I think it would be beneficial as the congregation works toward calling a regular pastor to have some time just to process all that you have been through in the last couple of years.

Please feel free to call, text or e-mail me. I will respond as quickly as I can but un-

fortunately because of the distance and my age I will not be able to drive to Lebanon on the spur of the moment.

Please include me in your daily prayers. Pastor Paul and I have been praying for you already and will continue to do so. I'm looking forward to this new adventure we are on together.

Also, on a side note, my given name is Sara but I've had Sally as a nickname my whole life. It's no law, but when I write Pastor, I write Sally (more informal) and when I write Reverend, I write Sara (more formal.) Some advice – never give your child two first names!

The Messiah Congregation Council met on Tuesday, April 9, 2024.

- Fellowship: There was good response/feedback of Easter breakfast. Donations of \$108.00 were collected and deposited to the General Fund.
- Finance: The Interim Pastor Agreement has been signed by the Rev. Sara ("Sally") Gausmann and the Congregation Council and has been forwarded to the bishop's office. A new email address will be created for the interim pastor.
- Property: Electrical upgrades have been completed in the church offices. We're waiting on a bid from Long's Tree Service for tree trimming of dead and low hanging branches. We will receive bids for a solar light for the parking lot light in the back corner.
- Social Ministry: Committee continues to send birthday cards and Easter cards and makes phone calls to shut-ins.
- Stewardship: Meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 7.
- Kathy Lilley has been approved to be the delegate from Messiah at the NALC Convocation which will be held online on Friday, August 9.
- Recommendation to purchase a laptop and necessary software for designated use by the pastor has been approved. The computer used by Pastor Kendall is over 10 years old.
- There was discussion to return to the use of bread instead of wafers for Communion. Deb Lutz will review several local bakeries and make a recommendation to start using for services in May.
